OPTION A – Proof of Permanent Fund Dividend Eligibility

Your answer to **ALL** of the following criteria must be yes to qualify under option A. Documentation of State of Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend eligibility or receipt must be attached to this form.

I am eligible for resident tuition assessment because I:

- 1) Was qualified by the State of Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend Division to receive an Alaska Permanent Fund Dividend within the last twelve months; and
- 2) Can certify that I have been in Alaska for the past twelve months; and
- 3) Declare my intent to remain in Alaska indefinitely.

In the past two years, I have **NOT**:

- Been absent from Alaska for an aggregate of more than 120 days other than documented absences due to illness, or attendance at another educational institution while maintaining Alaska residency;
- Acted inconsistently with Alaska residency, such as claiming residency in another state or voting as a resident of another state;
- Registered as a resident in an educational institution in another state; or
- Paid tuition at the University of Alaska at the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) program rate.

OPTION B – Proof of Physical Presence

Your answer to **ONE** of the following criteria must be yes to qualify under option B, and all documentation must be attached to this form.

I am eligible for resident tuition assessment because I have been physically present in Alaska for two or more years and I am supplying:

- Documentation that I moved my household goods to Alaska prior to 2 years ago; or
- Documentation of my lease, rental, or ownership of real property in Alaska for at least the prior 2 years; or
- Documentation of my permanent employment in Alaska for at least the prior 2 years; or
- Other indicia of Alaska residency for the 2 prior years deemed satisfactory by the MAU Chief Enrollment Officer or designee.

In the past two years, I have **NOT**:

- Been absent from Alaska for an aggregate of more than 120 days other than documented absences due to illness, or attendance at another educational institution while maintaining Alaska residency;
- Acted inconsistently with Alaska residency, such as claiming residency in another state, voting as a resident of another state or obtaining a driver's license from another state;
- Registered as a resident in an educational institution in another state; or
- Paid tuition at the University of Alaska at the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) program rate.

OPTION C – Exemption of Non-Resident Surcharge

Your answer to **ONE** of the following criteria must be yes to qualify under option C, and all documentation will be required when this form is submitted. A student does **NOT** need to complete this form to enroll in up to four credit hours within the UA system during a semester at the resident tuition rate.

Note: If you are a beneficiary on a University of Alaska College Savings Plan account and have been for the past two years you may be entitled to a waiver of the non-resident surcharge up to the amount of tuition being paid for by your college savings plan account. To determine your eligibility and request a waiver, call the UA College Savings Plan office at (907) 474-5671; you do not need to submit this form.

I am eligible for resident tuition assessment because I am:

- United States personnel on active duty, their spouse, or dependent child.
- A United States veteran eligible for a Veterans Administration education benefit or the spouse or dependent child of said veteran. Qualifying students must move to and remain domiciled in the state of Alaska during their course of study.
- A member of the National Guard, their spouse, or dependent child.
- A dependent child of a person who graduated and holds an Associate, Bachelor's, Master's or Doctor's degree from the University of Alaska. Dependency must be demonstrated by the most current federal income tax return that has been filed within the past 16 months.

- A student that graduated within the past twelve months from a qualified Alaska high school. To be considered a qualified high school for the purposes of UA residency tuition assessment, a high school must be located in the State of Alaska, issue a diploma recognized by the Alaska Department of Education and:
 - be a public high school listed in the current State of Alaska Department of Education directory; or
 - be accredited by the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools; or
 - be a private school properly registered with the State of Alaska Department of Education.

I am a United States citizen or eligible non-citizen and I am declaring my intention to remain in Alaska indefinitely. I certify that I am or will be an Alaskan resident for tuition purposes as defined above and will file an application for resident tuition with the appropriate UAA, UAF, or UAS admissions office prior to the published end of the add/drop period for regular semester-length courses time period of instruction for the semester for which residency is sought. My failure to file by this date will waive any claim for resident tuition assessment in that semester or prior semesters unless otherwise determined by the chief enrollment officer. Applicants with prior documented Alaska residency will be granted a 60-day extension to the above stated deadline to prove re-establishment of their residency.
