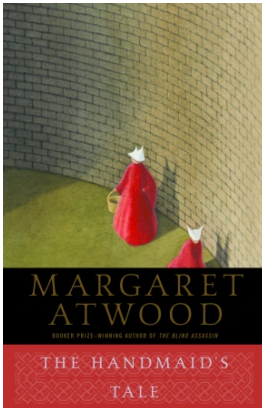
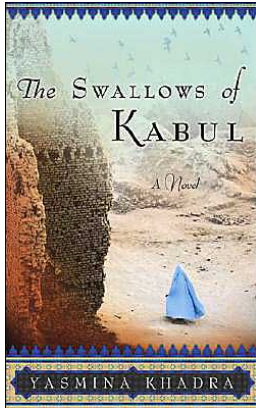

Responsibilities

In coordination with the Office of Community Partnerships, the Faculty Associate will:

- Develop and present two faculty workshops per semester around the Books (in cooperation with CAFE).
- Assist faculty to include the Books within their course curricula.
- Help faculty assess the quality of classroom discussion generated by the issues in the Books.
- Work with Campus Life, Residence Life, and campus groups to develop opportunities and activities for discussion and student interaction around the Books.
- Talk with community groups about the themes and issues of the Books, and encourage their involvement in discussions.

Goals of the Project

The 2007-08 Books of the Year will build on the positive energy generated in the first year of the joint UAA/APU Books of the Semester (2006-07).

The Books of the Year:

- Reinforces learning both inside and outside of the classroom.
- Provides opportunities to model academic behaviors of inquiry, interpretation, active listening, exploration, and tolerance of diverse viewpoints.
- Enhances student retention by increasing involvement on the campus.
- Provides opportunities for multi-disciplinary involvement with APU faculty and students around the themes and issues.
- Engages the community.
