Resolution concerning the crisis in Israel

Recognizing that the nation-state of Israel has the right to self determination and existence, and a voice in how its territory ought to be used, and that the Palestinians have a right to establish a state, and have a right to survival,

Noting with Concern the recent elevation of violence in the Gaza strip, with the death of over 1300 Palestinians, and the deaths of 13 Israelis,

Recalling the failure of UN Security Council Resolution 1860, which calls for an immediate cease fire so that humanitarian aid to the region could resume,

Recognizing Article 25 of the United Nations Charter, which states unequivocally that all nation states “agree, accept, and carry out the decisions of the Security Council”,

Noting that Israel is a nation-state of the United Nations and receives aid from the United Nations, and ought to obey the rulings of this council,

1. *Demands* the immediate cease fire of both Israel and Palestine so that NGO’s such as Amnesty International and the Red Cross can resume aid to the war torn region;
2. *Calls upon* the United Nations to form an international peacekeeping task force to enforce the above cease fire;
3. *Demands* that the terrorist organization of Hamas cease operations and surrender the government of Palestine to civilians;
4. *Requests* that Israel, in exchange for this cease fire and change of government in Palestine, recognize the right of the Palestinian people to self-determination and halt all attempts to annex the territory currently held by Palestine;
5. *Requests* that the nations of the world engage in an arms embargo of both Israel and such Palestinian organizations as Hamas and the Palestinian Liberation Organization (PLO).
