

Applying for Admissions at UAA

Steps for Success:

1. Apply for either non-degree or degree seeking admissions online at <http://uaonline.alaska.edu>.
2. Meet the degree seeking admission deadlines: Fall: July 1; Spring: November 1; Summer: May 1. (Non-degree admission does not have a deadline).
3. Submit admission documents (transcripts, test scores, etc.).
4. Proceed with registration.
5. Register for New Student Orientation: www.uaa.alaska.edu/orientation.

Applying for Admissions at UAA

1. Go to UAA's webpage: www.uaa.alaska.edu
2. Click on UAOnline/Wolflink on the bottom right-hand corner of the page, or <http://uaonline.alaska.edu>
3. Click on Apply for Admissions if you are a new student, or Login to a Secured Area if you are a returning student. Returning students have attended any of the University of Alaska schools in the past. If you are a returning student, but do not know your User ID (UA Student ID), click here: https://uaonline.alaska.edu/banprod/owa/bwgk2gid.P_DisplayID_Request
4. If you are a new student, you'll be asked to create a login ID and a PIN to enter the UAOnline site. Click on First Time User Account Creation at the bottom of the page. Returning students enter their UA Student ID and, if it is the first time logging in, use their birthday (mmddyy) as their PIN.
5. UAA has two undergraduate admission pathways:

Degree seeking admission

- \$40 for Associate degree application; \$50 for Bachelor degree
- Requires transcripts and/or test scores in order to complete admissions
- Deadline of July 1st for Fall semester (begins in late August); November 1st for Spring semester (begins in mid-January); May 1st for Summer semester (begins in the end of May).
- Students who are degree seeking are eligible for financial aid (student loans, grants, work study, and most scholarships)

Non-degree seeking admissions

- Free application
- No transcripts and/or test scores are required for admission
- No deadline
- Students are not eligible for financial aid
- Credits count toward graduation
- Typically the option for students who miss the deadline to apply for degree seeking admission, or for students who wish to take a few classes for personal benefit without necessarily earning a degree

6. When you apply for admission, you are required to choose either a degree seeking or non-degree seeking application. The requirements for the degree seeking application are as follows:

Associate or Certificate programs

(Less than 30 college credits)

- Official high school or GED transcript
- Any official college transcripts

(30 college credits or more)

- All official college transcripts)

Bachelor programs

(Less than 30 college credits)

- Official high school or GED transcript
- Official SAT, ACT, or ACCUPLACER test scores
- Any official college transcripts

(30 college credits or more)

- All official college transcripts
- Placement scores may be required if math or English courses are not taken

*If you are unable to obtain your high school or GED transcript, UAA may be able to admit you under the Ability to Benefit process. Call Enrollment Services at 907-786-1480 for more information.

7. All transcripts and test scores must be sent to the university in a sealed envelope, preferably directly from the educational institution or testing agency. If you choose to deliver the transcripts or test scores directly to the university, do not open the official envelope or the transcripts or test scores will be considered unofficial. 8. After you complete the degree seeking application online, submit your application with a credit or debit card payment. If you do not submit your payment within 21 days, your application will be deleted.

9. Keep in mind that deadlines at UAA are very important toward starting a successful academic career. As soon as you apply for admission, you are eligible to register for classes almost immediately. Registration for each semester begins around the following times:

Fall semester: beginning of November

Spring and Summer semesters: beginning of April

10. Register online for classes as early as possible each semester. Be sure you meet with your academic advisor for accurate and helpful assistance with course registration. For a list of advisors, click here:

11. Check on the status of your admission application—the entire admission processing time can take up to eight weeks after you submit your final transcript, so be sure to review your admission status online via UAOnline or contact Enrollment Services at 907-786-1480.

Spring: November 1st
Summer: May 1st

Your next steps:

1. Submit official high school, GED, or college transcripts to UAA Enrollment Services, PO Box 141629, Anchorage, AK 99514.
2. Take the ACCUPLACER test in Advising & Testing Center (located in UC: 786-4500).
3. Meet with your Academic Adviser. Remember that you may register for classes even if you haven't received your certificate of admission letter yet.
