## **Action Items from Last Meeting (October 3, 2025):**

The following Assessment Plans were reviewed and approved. \*\*Denotes examples of change based on assessment.

- Biological Sciences BA & BS Plan is working. Recommendations made for consideration. Program will resubmit
  the plan with changes based on the conversation with the committee.
  - \*\*Changes made from previous assessment included change in student use of ePortfolio.
- Natural Sciences BS Plan is working. This is a collaborative degree, so data is gathered from multiple departments. Program will resubmit the plan with changes based on the conversation with the committee.
- Computer Sciences BA & BS Approved. Committee noted that the plan is working well, and program demonstrated
  how they are using assessment, as well as input from their advisory board, to make improvements. \*\*PSLO added in
  response to recommendation by the Industry Advisory Board.
- Computer Systems Engineering BS Approved. Committee noted that the plan is working well, and program demonstrated how they are using assessment, as well as input from their advisory board, to make improvements.

AAC members will review plans for programs making changes that haven't been reviewed in the past year.

There is a change in the CIM process and the AAC program assessment plan review process. Programs making curricular changes that are required to move through the Faculty Senate UAB/GAB review process will be asked to also discuss their assessment plan at an AAC meeting if it has been more than a year since their last review. This may understandably impact the workload of committee members given the review of more Assessment Plans.
