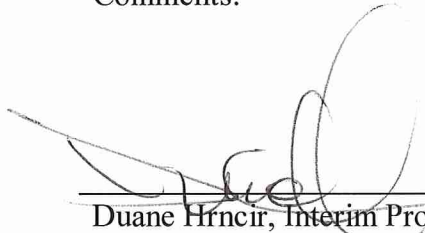

In anticipation of a future in which there may be enough resources to allow me to teach a few more upper-division courses, I would love to still have this course in the catalog as a capstone GER.
