IX. Informational Items and Adjournment

International Graduate Students

International students who intend to reside in the U.S. for the purpose of pursuing a certificate or degree as F-1 visa students and need a form I-20 Certificate of Eligibility for Non-immigrant F-1 Student Status must meet university and degree program admission requirements and submit the following:

- Official TOEFL (minimum score of 79-80 IBT) or IELTS (minimum score of 6-6.5) scores, completed within the last two years and sealed by the issuing agency. International students may request an exemption from the language exam requirements if they:
 - are a native speaker of English or if English is their first language, or
 - have earned a bachelor's or master's degree from a regionally accredited U.S. institution.

Alternate documentation of English proficiency may be considered on a case-by-case basis and approved by the program faculty and dean of the college.

The University reserves the right to require additional English proficiency evidence, even from those who are eligible for an examination exemption.

- A notarized affidavit of financial support from the student or the student's financial sponsor and documentation of financial resources to cover one full academic year of study.
- A completed Admissions Agreement for Prospective F-1 Students.

Students who earned their baccalaureate degree outside the U.S. or English-speaking Canada must submit an international credential evaluation from the WES ICAP Course-by-Course Evaluation Service, stating that they have earned the equivalent of a U.S. baccalaureate degree. Evaluations should be sent directly to the UAA Office of Admissions, P.O. Box 141629, Anchorage, AK 99514-1629.

- Students who have earned multiple bachelor degrees or already hold an advanced degree should contact the program to which they are applying to determine if a WES ICAP is needed for all institutions attended. In some cases, an evaluation only for the previous study most relevant to their UAA program will be needed. These decisions are made by the program faculty and approved by the dean of the college.

Students transferring from other institutions in the U.S. must also complete and submit the F-1 Transfer Eligibility Form.

International students in F-1 visa status must be formally admitted, full-time, degree-seeking students. Health insurance is mandatory. Visit the [International Student Services](#) website for details and forms.

Re: Preserve Econ A429 and Econ A640

Comments:

I am writing to request that two economics courses not be purged from the catalog. Below I provide justification for each course.

Econ A429, Business Forecasting: Business Forecasting has not been taught for the last several years due largely to a lack of faculty resources. This is my first year serving as Chair and making this course content available to CBPP students is a priority. Within the last few months Assistant Professor Angie Zheng, who has extensive experience in time series data analysis and in business forecasting, expressed an interest in teaching the course. Prior to the course purge notification we made plans for Prof. Zheng to teach the course in Fall 2017. In addition, we are gaining a new ISER economist with extensive background in data analytics; his addition provides greater flexibility in covering data oriented courses.

Taking either Econ 429 or Econ 312 (Econometrics) is required for Economics majors, Finance majors, and Marketing majors; in addition, both courses have historically been popular electives for other CBPP BBA majors. Business Forecasting focuses on analyzing time series data and forecasting future events (e.g. sales or revenue) while Econometrics is a broader introduction to regression analysis and emphasizes use of cross-sectional and panel data - time series is not typically covered in econometrics. Given the explosion in the availability of firm level data, businesses across the country expect greater aptitude from business professionals in data analytics relative to years past. Preserving Econ 429 will allow us to maintain and eventually reconfigure an important course option for business students.

Econ A640, Economics of Transportation: This course has also not been taught for the last few years due to a lack of faculty resources. Economics of Transportation is particularly valuable for Masters students in the Global Supply Chain Management MS program; it is also a popular elective for MPA and MBA students. Professor of Logistics, Dr. Darren Prokop, who has a PhD in Economics, has requested to teach this course in Spring 2017 and I fully support his request and don't foresee any reason this course cannot be offered.





SUBJ: Retention of doctoral psychology courses listed on the UAA Purge List 2016-17

1. I am writing to provide justification to retain all doctoral psychology courses listed on the UAA Purge List.
2. Our Ph.D. Program in Clinical-Community Psychology is a joint program with UAA and UAF. As such, our courses are taught by program faculty from either UAF or UAA. The following courses listed on the UAA Purge List are required courses that in fact, have been taught each academic year; however, since they have been taught by UAF faculty, they have been identified as courses on the purge list. These courses include:
 - a. PSY A602-AS, Native Ways of Knowing
 - b. PSY A603-AS, Alaskan and Rural Psychology
 - c. PSY A605-AS, History and Systems
 - d. PSY A616-AS, Program Evaluation I
 - e. PSY A617-AS, Program Evaluation II
 - f. PSY A658 Qualitative Analysis

This is a recurring issue for such courses that are offered to students in the Joint Program, but are taught by our UAF-based program faculty.

3. There are four remaining courses listed on the purge list that are electives, one is currently being offered at UAF and the other three have not been taught by either UAA or UAF faculty in recent years:
 - a. PSY A601 – AS, Integration Seminar
 - b. PSY A606 – AS, Native Ways of Healing (currently being offered this semester)
 - d. PSY A671-AS, Grant Writing

Nevertheless, I respectfully request that they remain listed in the next edition of the course catalog. Our Joint Ph.D. Program in Clinical-Community Psychology has 59 active students (35 at UAA; 24 at UAF). Our training program and objectives are based on a scientist-practitioner model. As such, it is essential that our doctoral students, particularly those pursuing careers at universities and academic health centers, are trained in multivariate statistics and grant writing to be competent researchers in the behavioral sciences. However, given the size of our program and the other major training foci of our program, these courses cannot be offered frequently. Therefore, I request that they be removed from the purge list and remain in the course offerings in the next edition of the UAA course catalog.
