ABOUT UAA

Surrounded by an environment that is both urban and wild, the University of Alaska Anchorage is a gateway to innovative thinking, learning and exploration. UAA is the state's largest university, situated at the heart of Alaska's largest city, with satellites in Homer, Kodiak, Soldotna, Valdez and Mat-Su. UAA students experience a

hands-on education, in and out of the classroom.

The university offers unique opportunities in academics, research and



leadership, as well as real-world experience through community partners locally and globally. UAA's students and faculty come from diverse backgrounds, yet the university community is firmly rooted in Alaska, a place known for its exciting recreation and career opportunities.

Research

Research is central to UAA's mission. Researchers work closely with federal and state scientists in critical areas like fisheries management,

climate change and resource extraction, creating cutting-edge field internships and research opportunities for students. UAA established the Innovate awards in 2011 to provide an incentive for innovative research and then launched Seawolf Holdings LLC, establishing a pathway toward commercialization of UAA research. Zensor, a new generation of wireless sensors for remote



monitoring, asset management, surveillance and security, became the first startup company formed in Alaska based upon research by UAA faculty. Two other startups followed: CFT Solutions, which boasts a patent-pending innovation to keep sidewalks ice and snow free, and Cogniceutic Solutions LLC, which is researching and developing nutritional therapies and interventions to improve memory and cognition. UAA has 38 invention disclosures, with 32 patents filed and five patents issued. Alexandra West recently became the first student to earn a

place on the UAA Patent Wall of Fame for devising a water-powered fish carcass disposal system that will create a safer environment for people who fish in areas near bear populations.

Workforce Development and Education

UAA is a leader in workforce development with informal, almost neighborly, associations to business, state and community leaders. Anchorage is the state's hub for transportation, communications, health care, engineering, trade, service and finance. UAA collaborates with community partners to create efficient programs to meet the needs of these high-demand career fields in

Alaska. Friendly and open access to people, prospects and possibilities empowers students to succeed, knowing they can make

The Wells Fargo Sports Complex closed for renovations during the summer of 2015, with a scheduled reopening in September 2015. Redesigning this space for more recreational student use will happen in phases. These and campus performance venues are a full ecosystem of opportunity for concerts and lectures, athletic events and art exhibitions. Students at UAA have endless opportunities to socialize and learn from each other.


Centers and Institutes


