

# AN 8-HOUR SHIFT AT THE GOLD CORD MILL

A mill shift was study in repetition, and yet daily routines varied because tasks were influenced by the technologies used, by changes in an ore's characteristics, and by the skill and attitude of the mill man. In short, a mill man's job was at once repetitive and individualized. This illustration depicts tasks that Dan Renshaw recalls performing during a typical shift. It assumes gold values of an ounce per ton and a consistent water supply from the mill's water tank.
