CareerOneStop, formerly America's Career Kit, is a workforce development portal connecting users to relevant links, resources, and community services offered over the Internet, as well as directing them to the information and services provided through the core products listed within this section.

#### **CareerOneStop Components**

#### Jobseekers Links

Allows jobseekers to post their resumes and search job listings, learn how to write effective resumes and negotiate a salary, explore wages and occupational trends, locate potential employers and local workforce services, and more.

#### **Employers Links**

Allows employers to post job openings and search the resume database, find wages and employment trends, create customized job descriptions, find occupational licensing requirements and federal labor regulations, locate workforce services and other employers by industry, and more.

#### Students / Learners

Allows students and learners to explore career possibilities, search for schools and colleges, find funding for their education, learn about tests and assessments, search for certification and career possibilities, and more.

#### **Workforce / Human Resource Professionals**

Allows workforce professionals to find nearby One-Stop Career Centers and other service providers, locate training for workforce professionals, view their states' WIA eligible training providers, research hiring guidelines, stay informed on new workforce issues, and more.

Career InfoNet is an electronic storehouse of national, state and local labor market data with employment trends, wages, and more. It also lists millions of employers by industry, occupation and name, as well as prevailing wages and living costs anywhere in the country.

#### **Career InfoNet Components**

#### General Outlook

Look at general job market trends for different education levels.

Look at trends by occupational ranking - Fastest Growing, Most Openings, Largest Employment, Declining Employment, or Highest Paying.

Narrow the results by entering an educational level - **Overall**, **Requiring only work experience or on-the-job training**, **Requiring post-secondary training or an associate's degree**, or **Requiring a Bachelor's degree**.

A list of the top 25 careers under the criteria will be displayed.

#### Wages & Trends

Provides wage and occupational outlook information for a selected occupation in a state.

After selecting a specific occupation, an **Occupation Report**, which contains **Typical Education Level**, **Description**, **Wages** and **Trends**, will display.

The **Detailed Wages** report allows you to compare the wages for up to five different occupations in ten local areas in the selected state.

The **Industry Trends** report displays national data on industries that hire people in the occupation.

The **Customized Report** allows users to print out selected reports.

#### What It Takes

Find the important knowledge, skills and abilities necessary for an occupation.

#### **State Information**

Find state demographic and economic information, as well as links to education, cultural and recreational resources.

Provides a **State Profile** with a list of the top 25 occupations in the state for selected criteria - **Occupational ranking** and the **Average worker education level**.

Detailed information, maps and driving directions to state specific services at local One-Stop Career Centers.

Labor Market Information for selected states.

America's Job Bank is the biggest and busiest job market in cyberspace with 400,000 resumes online and over a million jobs nationwide. Employers can post job listings and search resumes nationwide. Jobseekers can post resumes electronically and reach employers across the country.

# JOBBANK Components for Jobseekers

#### **Quick Search Option**

Users can do a quick job search without logging in.

- 1. Select **Job Category** from the list.
- 2. Choose to search National / International or Within a 50 mile radius of Zip Code.
- 3. If you choose to search by zip code, enter it into the box or select **Zip Code Finder** to find an area to search.
- 4. Click Search.

#### **Alternative Search Methods**

Below the Quick Search window, there are alternative search links.

- 1. Job Title Keyword Military Job Number.
- 2. To begin a **Personalized Job Search**, at the top of the Jobseekers section of the Job Bank home page, click **Sign up** to create your personal job search profile for user sessions or click the **Login** link to retrieve job search information.

#### Resume Builder

There are three types of resumes that can be posted with AJB.

- 1. A **Traditional Resume** includes all the data normally found in a written resume and facilitates efficient matching of jobs to resumes and resumes to jobs.
- 2. An **Express Resume** includes only minimal information, such as contact information, skills, and educational attainment.
- 3. Also, an **Open Format Resume** allows you to supply an ASCII copy of your resume.

#### Job Scout

**Job Scout** runs designated searches automatically at a selected frequency, e-mails you as to how many jobs were found and of the number of those jobs that were posted since the last search was made, and lists the results with links to the job postings from the search.

America's Service Locator (ASL) connects users to local offices providing the employment and training services they need. Local One-Stop Career Centers offer information on finding a job, planning a career, locating training, dealing with job loss, and recruiting employees. Employers and jobseekers can find the services they need at a convenient One-Stop Career Center. Users just enter their zip code and select the desired service(s); or pick up the phone and dial **1-877-US-2JOBS** for direct assistance.

## **SERVICELOCATOR Components**

#### Find A Service

Search for services **For Business**, **For Workers**, or **For Youth** by entering either a zip code or entering a city and state. A list of One-Stop Career Centers offering the desired services in the selected area will display.

#### **Find A One-Stop Career Center**

Find local One-Stop Career Centers by entering either a zip code or a city and state. A list of One-Stop Career Centers offering the desired services in the selected area will display.

#### **Keyword Search**

Search for services by entering a keyword, a zip code or a city and state. A list of One-Stop Career Centers offering the desired services in the selected area will display.

#### Office Search

Search state records for specific service provider by selecting a state and type of office. Users can narrow the search by specifying a city, state and/or type of office.

#### Maps

Click on a state on the United States map to retrieve a directory of service providers. Users can also select from menus at the bottom of the page to search a **State Phone Directory**, a **State Web Directory**, or **National Locators**.

The Occupational Information Network database is a comprehensive source of descriptions and skill sets for specific occupations. O\*NET OnLine allows both the public and private sector to directly access key data for identifying and developing the skills of the American workforce. O\*NET, the Occupational Information Network system, provides information about skills, knowledge, abilities, tasks and the context in which work is done. O\*NET was developed to supersede the Dictionary of Occupational Titles (DOT). The primary users of O\*NET information are jobseekers, students, and employers as well as professionals in human resources, workforce investment, and career development. By using O\*NET information, users are able to compare skills and other occupational attributes across occupations, develop job descriptions and resumes, and examine education and training requirements. O\*NET OnLine 4.0 is a web-based viewer for the O\*NET database.

#### O\*NET OnLine Components

#### **Find Occupations**

Using a keyword search is one of the three ways to find an occupation of interest. The other "Find Occupations" searches are by code or job family.

Review the results of the keyword search and select an occupation from the list to examine further. Then, select the type of report desired.

#### Skills Search

Select skills from the following skills categories: basic, social, problem-solving, technical, systems, and resource management. Upon completion of the skills search, occupations will be identified that use those skills.

#### Crosswalk

Link to O\*NET information using other coding systems - for example, identify Military occupations related to civilian O\*NET occupations, or match Apprenticeship opportunities to O\*NET occupational information.

#### **Summary Report**

An occupational report is provided for each search option described above. This is an example of the "Summary" Report. You may also select the "Details" or "Custom" Reports.

Each occupational report ends with a direct link to ACINet Wages and Employment information for the occupation selected.

Workforce Tools of the Trade is designed to help workforce development professionals gain the knowledge and skills they need to excel at their job. The U.S. Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration has developed the O\*NET Career Exploration Tools, a group of career counseling assessment tools. The tools are designed to assist a wide variety of users with identifying information about themselves. They can use this self-knowledge to guide their exploration of occupations included in the Occupational Information Network (O\*NET), the replacement of the Dictionary of Occupational Titles.

The tools stress whole-person assessment. Users are able to take a variety of valid and reliable assessments, each providing important information that can help them explore the world of work. The O\*NET Career Exploration Tools include:

- O\*NET Ability Profiler
- O\*NET Interest Profiler
- O\*NET Computerized Interest Profiler
- O\*NET Work Importance Locator
- O\*NET Work Importance Profiler

O\*NET Career Exploration Tools are designed to be interactive and flexible. Individuals are able to take one or all of the instruments, depending on their particular needs. They also may take the tools in conjunction with privately-developed career counseling tools. Additionally, the O\*NET Interest and Work Importance tools can be self-administered by a large percentage of individuals, with no outside assistance. The tools provide individuals with results presented on score reports that are self-interpretable. The tools and their associated reports also are useful for group settings, such as training programs, classrooms, and job search programs.

Electronic components of the Ability Profiler, Ability Profiler, Computerized Interest Profiler, Work Importance Locator, and the Work Importance Profiler tools (e.g., instruments, software, score reports, master list of occupations, and user's guides, along with documentation and supplementary reports) are available for **download** from the O\*NET website at:



#### Occupational Safety Training Program

The Occupational Safety Training Program assists students in learning how to practice preventive safety measures. It teaches individuals to take precautions in the work place that they might normally take for granted. The program consists of 8 easy lessons. Each helps individuals to better understand the variety of dangers they might encounter or be exposed to on the job as well as best safety practices. Lesson plans include:

Lesson 1: Safety on walking and working surfaces
Lesson 2: Basics of fire protection and emergency exits

Lesson 3: Protective guards on machinery

Lesson 4: Electrical hazards

Lesson 5: Basics of hazard communications terms

Lesson 6: Equipment used on the job (clothing, gloves, shoes, helmets, etc.)

Lesson 7: Equipment tagging and locking

Lesson 8: Safe material handling

#### **Occupational Health Training Program**

The Occupational Health Training Program assists individuals is comprehending basic health safety information. The program is broken down into 5 lessons and focuses on preventing students from getting injured while on the job. The following health training areas are covered:

Lessons 1-3: Prevention - understanding occupational health safety, personal and industrial hygiene and knowing their work environment.

Lessons 4-5: Knowing what to do if hurt on the job - basic fist aid and CPR.

Both Safety Programs are designed to help students learn independently or with a facilitator. Exams, provided at the end of each lesson, can be used to demonstrate competency for each topic and be graded, if necessary. Teachers are also supplied a manual to guide students through materials, and the manual contains answers to all of the tests.

The Student Guide: Financial Aid from the U.S. Department of Education

The United States Department of Education administers numerous financial assistance programs. These programs consist of loans and / or grants. Through their publication entitled, *The Student Guide* individuals can obtain detailed information on all the financial assistance programs available.

To receive aid from any federal student aid program individuals must meet certain requirements. The law suspends aid eligibility for students convicted under federal or state law of sale or possession of illegal drugs. The period of ineligibility varies and depends on whether the conviction was for sale or possession, and whether the student had previous offences. The student regains eligibility when the period of suspension ends, or in some cases, only when the student completes an acceptable drug rehabilitation program. If you have a conviction or convictions of these offenses, call 1-800-4-FED-AID to find out how, or if, this law applies to you. Even if you're ineligible for federal aid, you should complete the FAFSA because schools use this application for awarding nonfederal aid.

Incarcerated persons have limited eligibility for federal student aid. An incarcerated person is eligible for a Pell Grant only if he or she is incarcerated in a nonfederal or nonstate penal institution, such as a local or county jail.

## HUD's Public Housing Program

Public housing was established to provide decent and safe rental housing for eligible low-income families, the elderly, and persons with disabilities. Public housing comes in all sizes and shapes, from scattered single family houses to high-rise apartments for elderly families. There are currently approximately 1.3 million households living in public housing units, managed by some 3,300 Housing Authorities. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) administers Federal aid to local housing agencies (HA) who manage the housing for low-income residents at rents they can afford. HUD furnishes technical and professional assistance in planning, developing and managing these developments.

Public housing is limited to low-income families and individuals. An HA determines your eligibility based on: 1) annual gross income; 2) whether you qualify as elderly, a person with a disability, or as a family; and 3) U.S. citizenship or immigration status.

#### Housing Choice Vouchers (Section 8)

The housing choice voucher program is the federal government's major program for assisting very low-income families, the elderly, and the disabled to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing in the private market. Since housing assistance is provided on behalf of the family or individual, participants are able to find their own housing, including single-family homes, townhouses and apartments. The participant is free to choose any housing that meets the requirements of the program and is not limited to units located in subsidized housing projects.

Housing Choice Vouchers are administered locally by public housing agencies (PHAs). The PHAs receive federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to administer the voucher program.

A housing subsidy is paid to the landlord directly by the PHA on behalf of the participating family. The family then pays the difference between the actual rent charged by the landlord and the amount subsidized by the program. Under certain circumstances, if authorized by the PHA, a family may use its voucher to purchase a modest home.

The direct and indirect impacts of housing development and rehabilitation reverberate throughout the nation. Residential construction and rehabilitation stimulate various manufacturing and trade industries and related professional services. Housing activities also benefits the larger economy as wages are earned and spent by those directly involved in housing development. RHS has played a significant role in the National Partnership for Homeownership to help more women and minorities achieve their homeownership goals.

There are more than 2.5 million substandard housing units in rural America. Rural Housing Service (RHS) housing programs help address this challenge by annually financing new or improved housing for over 65,000 low - to moderate - income families annually. Over 2 million families now own their homes as a result of the RHS rural homeownership programs.

RHS offers two types of home ownership loans: guaranteed and direct loans. The purpose is to provide financing - with no downpayment and at favorable rates and terms - either through a direct loan with RHS or with a loan from a private financial institution which is guaranteed by RHS. These loans are for the purchase, construction, rehabilitation, or relocation of a dwelling and related facilities for low - or moderate - income rural persons.

# Self - Help Housing

Self-Help Housing Loans help groups of six to ten low - income families build their own homes by providing materials and the skilled labor they cannot furnish themselves. The families must agree to work together until all homes are furnished.

# Rural Rental Housing Loans

Apartment living is often an alternative for people who cannot afford the purchase price and maintenance costs of their own individual house. Rural Rental Housing loans are made to finance building construction and site development of multi - family living quarters for people with low, very low and moderate incomes. Some units are reserved for people aged 62 and over. Loans can be made in this program to construct housing that will be operated in cooperative form, but loan funds may not be used to finance individual units within a project.

# Home Improvement Loans and Grants

Home Improvement and Repair Loans and Grants enable low - income rural homeowners to remove health and safety hazards from their homes and to make accessible for people with disabilities. Grants are available for people 62 years old and older who cannot afford to repay a loan.

## **Housing Preservation Grants**

These grants help low - income homeowners repair and rehabilitate their homes. Rental property owners can use them to repair and rehabilitate their units if they agree to make such units available to low - income families.

#### **Housing Subsidies**

RHS can help subsidize monthly mortgage and rental payments, limiting these costs to no more than 30 percent of the adjusted monthly income of the applicant.

These subsidies can be used for the direct home ownership, rural rental and farm labor programs described above.

# Farm Labor Housing

Farm Labor Housing Loans and Grants enable farmers, public or private nonprofit organizations, and units of State and local governments to build, buy, or repair farm labor housing in either dormitory or multifamily apartment styles.

#### What Prisoners Should Know About Social Security

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits generally are not payable for months that you are confined to a jail, prison or certain other public institutions for commission of a crime. And, you are not automatically eligible for Social Security or SSI benefits when you are released.

#### Who Can Get Benefits?

Social Security disability benefits can be paid only to people who have recently worked and paid Social Security taxes, and who are unable to work because of a serious medical condition that is expected to last at least a year or result in death. The fact that an individual is a recent parolee or is unemployed does not qualify as a disability. No benefits are payable for months in which you are confined to a jail, prison, or other correctional facility or certain other public institutions.

Social Security retirement benefits can be paid only to people who are 62 or older. Generally, you must have worked and paid taxes into Social Security for 10 years to be eligible. Benefits are usually not paid for the months you have been sentenced to a jail, prison or correctional facility or confined to certain public institutions for committing a crime.

SSI benefits can be paid to people who are 65 or older, blind or disabled and who have low income and few resources. No SSI benefits are payable for any month throughout which you reside in a jail, prison or certain other public institution.

In all cases, you must apply for benefits with a Social Security office if you think you qualify. Although you cannot receive benefits while you are confined to a jail, prison or certain other public institutions, your spouse or children, if they are eligible, can be paid benefits on your record.

# Social Security Can Help You In Other Ways

If you've lost your Social Security card, contact Social Security for a replacement. Many employers will not hire you, and many social service agencies will not be able to help you without a card.

If you want to find out how much your future Social Security benefits will be or if you want to check the earnings that have been reported for you to Social Security, you can get a free Social Security Statement.

#### Work Incentives Improvement Act

The Ticket to Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act is federal legislation which addresses the barriers to employment among persons with disabilities who receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and / or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI). While it is common knowledge that many persons receiving these benefits may require this support into retirement age, it is recognized that many persons can successfully return to work with proper information, guidance, and individualized support.

The "Ticket to Work" is a specialized work incentive. It is intended for anyone ages 18 - 64 receiving SSI and / or SSDI who is interested and capable of working to a capacity such that his cash benefits would be terminated in a relatively brief period. Use of this work incentive is optional. 1-866-968-7842 (Maximus)

A key service element is the Benefits Planning Assistance and Outreach Program (BPAO). The BPAO Program is conducted under cooperative agreements between SSA and local organizations to deliver customer-friendly analysis of the impact of earned income on SSA cash benefits and related health care. BPAO staff are trained and certified in benefits counseling under the direction of SSA. The service is available to anyone receiving an SSI and / or SSDI cash payment between the ages of 14-64. Ideally this service is targeted for persons who are working or are considering work in the near future.

#### **Other SSA Work Incentives**

For individuals who are interested in work, but may not be able to reach termination through the Ticket Program, SSA offers an array of other work incentives, including:

- Earned Income Exclusion for In-School Youth receiving SSI
- Earned Income Exclusion for Persons Receiving SSI due to Blindness
- SSI Eligibility after Earning Substantial Activity Amount
- Plan for Achieving Self-Support (PASS)
- Trial Work Period for SSDI Beneficiaries
- Extended Period of Eligibility for SSDI Beneficiaries
- Expedited Reinstatement

Individuals interested in any of these programs are encouraged to contact your local BPAO provider to learn how these work incentives and others will allow you to reach your individual goals.



### **Child Support Enforcement**

The Child Support Enforcement (CSE) Program is a Federal / State / local partnership to collect child support: We want to send the strongest possible message that parents cannot walk away from their children. Our goals are to ensure that children have the financial support of both their parents, to foster responsible behavior towards children, and to reduce welfare costs.

The CSE Program was established in 1975 as Title IV-D of the Social Security Act. It functions an all States and territories, through the State / county Social Service Department, Attorney General's Office or Department of Revenue. Most States work with prosecuting attorneys, other law enforcement agencies, and officials of family or domestic relations courts to carry out the program at the local level.

State Child Support Programs locate noncustodial parents, establish paternity, establish and enforce support orders, and collect child support payments. While programs vary from State to State, their services are available to all parents who need them.

The Federal Office of Child Support Enforcement is part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. It helps States develop, manage, and operate their programs effectively and according to Federal law. The office pays the major share of State program operating costs, provides policy guidance and technical help to enforcement agencies, conducts audits and educational programs, supports research, and shares ideas for program improvement.

The Office of Child Support Enforcement produces a publication entitled, *Handbook on Child Support Enforcement*. This valuable resource offers detailed information regarding child support enforcement. It also contains a listing of State Child Support Enforcement Offices. By contacting your local office you can obtain accurate information regarding all outstanding obligations.

## Loan Programs

The SBA is Congressionally mandated to assist the nation's small businesses in meeting their financial needs. The agency's finance programs enhance the ability of lenders to provide long - and short - term loans to small businesses that might not qualify through normal lending channels.

There are four basic types of SBA lending and equity investment programs available: the 7(a) Loan Guarantee Program, the 7 (m) Microloan Program, the 504 Certified Development Company Loan Program and the Small Business Investment Company Program. See **Appendix (C)** of this Manual for national contact information.

#### Eligibility

Loan applications can not be accepted from firms where a principal, owner, officer, director, key employee or principal of an affiliated business are currently incarcerated, on parole or on probation, or have been indicted for a felony or a crime of moral turpitude. Further, if probation or parole is lifted expressly because it prohibits an SBA loan the application would not be eligible.

This however does not preclude these individuals from receiving training or counseling through SBA sponsored or supported programs.

# **Small Business Development Center**

The Small Business Development Center provides management and technical assistance, counseling and training to current and prospective small business owners through SBDCs. Administered by the SBA, the SBDC program is a coop-erative effort of the private sector, the educational community, and federal, state and local governments. It includes treatment facilities that: 1) are licensed, certified, or otherwise approved for inclusion in the Directory by their State substance abuse agencies, and 2) responded to the most recent National Survey of Substance Abuse Treatment Services (N-SSATS). The information about each facility that appears in the Directory was provided by the facility in response to the N-SSATS. The N-SSATS is conducted annually by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.

The Directory is ordered alphabetically by State, by city within each State, and by facility name within each city. Each facility listing includes codes that represent the services offered and other features, including codes that indicate services for hearing impaired and non-English speaking clients. Codes are defined in a key shown on the cover flap and on pages throughout the Directory. Because the services offered by a particular facility may change over time, it is always a good idea to verify the information in the Directory when contacting a facility.

#### **Adult Rehabilitation Centers**

Parolees, and those on probation, may elect, or may be assigned, to enter one of these centers, with the approval of their parole or probation officer, and with the understanding that their program is a Christian, spiritual program. The program is offered at no cost to those without income and is especially appropriate for those with treatable handicaps and/or histories reflecting unemployment, homelessness, chemical dependency, chronic relapse, and/or multiple treatment experiences. These long-term residential programs assist program participants in the following areas: spiritual development, work therapy, individual counseling, group counseling, educational groups, 12-step meetings, and leisure/recreational activity planning.

#### **Harbor Light Centers**

Three of the most common Harbor Light Center residential programs include the following:

- **Social model detoxification** services are professional detoxification residential programs for alcoholics and drug addicts. Social workers, nurses, and recovery experts staff these programs 24 hours a day.
- Addiction treatment programs are licensed residential treatment programs for alcoholics and/ or drug addicts. Modern behavioral approaches to addiction counseling are combined with traditional 12-step group meetings and Salvation Army religious services.
- Halfway house programs for persons waiting for release from prison operate in cooperation with state and federal corrections authorities. These programs provide employment education and allow individuals to seek gainful employment and establish positive community relationships before being released from correctional supervision.
