
CREDIT HOUR DISTRIBUTION BY STUDENT HEADCOUNT



HIGHLIGHTS

One of the most dramatic changes in our student profile over the last decade is the combined growth in the number of degree-seeking students. Five years ago, certificate and degree-seeking students represented 47% of the student body. By Fall 11, that proportion had grown to 71%.

The number of first-time freshmen students increased 85% over the last 10 years. These students now comprise 11% of the total student body at UAA, up from 6.7% in Fall 01.

While UAA's total headcount increased modestly over the last 10 years, student credit hour production grew 34% as students increased their credit loads.
