From January to mid-August Advisors had over 21,000 appointments with students. They worked with colleagues in Student Affairs to provide Registration Labs at HOWL Days and to support students during the NSS/IRSC transition. ## **Faculty Success Report**

As we start the academic year, I'd like to thank the Instructional Design team and UAA Faculty for the outstanding efforts in our transition to Blackboard Ultra. As of now just over 36% of courses have been converted to Ultra! If you are interested in converting your courses for Spring, Instructional Design has developed a one-week, asynchronous training to help orient you in Ultra, help you evaluate how easily your courses will convert, and walk



you through the conversion process. The next training is from September 15-19, with more coming soon.

I would also like to acknowledge that over 15% of UAA's full-time faculty participated in this year's Fall Teaching Academy (FTA), averaging over 3 sessions attended! Topics included Generative AI in Higher Education, Learning Centered Assessment, Community Engaged Teaching, Information Literacy, Student Mentorship, and much more.
