Guest Speaker Bio: Leeva C. Chung, Ph.D., is a professor of Communication Studies, Director of the Individualized major, and an affiliate faculty member in Ethnic Studies, at the University of San Diego. Leeva enthusiastically developed a unique and innovative style of teaching which some describe as "organized chaos," but refers to methods of engagement such as project-based learning and integrating theory into practice within the context of the classroom. Her advocacy for student driven pedagogy has been recognized with numerous awards on campus, such as the Davies Award for Teaching Excellence, Faculty Changemaker Champion, Outstanding Preceptor Award, and the Innovation in Community Engagement Award.
