

Comparator Peer Benchmarking

Prepared for the University of Alaska Anchorage

In this report, Hanover Research provides detailed profiles for the 21 comparator peers identified by University of Alaska Anchorage. Each profile includes information on graduation rates, retention rates, part-time enrollment, degree-seeking status, student demographics, and degree conferrals. We also review overall trends across the group and benchmark UAA's performance compared to the comparator peers.

Introduction

Each comparator peer's profile includes information on graduation rates, retention rates, part-time enrollment, degree-seeking status, student demographics, and degree conferrals. With the exception of state demographic data,¹ all information presented in the profiles is from the National Center for Education Statistics' (NCES) Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

Analysis of Findings

In the next several pages, we present tables and figures summarizing overall trends among the 21 comparator institutions.

Similarity to University of Alaska Anchorage

We applied the same methodology to the comparator peers as outlined in the original report,² which assigned different weights to the similarity scores for variables of importance to University of Alaska Anchorage:

- Number of certificates awarded below the baccalaureate level (2010): 20%
- ❖ Associate degree conferrals (2010): 20%
- ❖ Total undergraduate enrollment: 5%
- ❖ Total graduate enrollment: 5%
- Percentage enrolled part-time (undergraduate): 20%
- ❖ Percentage enrolled part-time (graduate): 10%
- ❖ Percent American Indian/Alaska Native (total enrollment): 20%

The absolute value of the total weighted similarity score represents the overall similarity between each institution and UAA. For Hanover's list of peer institutions, each institution had a similarity score of less than 63 percent. However, in evaluating the similarity between UAA and the comparator peers, all but three institutions had a similarity score of more than 63 percent. The individual similarity scores are shown in Table 1; the institution least similar to UAA based on these criteria is Cleveland State University, with an overall score of 94.4 percent. Therefore, we can conclude that, based on the criteria listed above, the peer institutions generated by Hanover's methodology are more similar to UAA than the comparator peers provided by UAA.

Degrees Conferred in 2010

A unique quality of UAA is that it awards a sizable number of undergraduate certificates (shown in Table 2 as "certificates of 1 but less than 2-years" and "certificates of less than 1-year"). In 2010, UAA awarded a total of 176 certificates below the baccalaureate level. Among UAA's comparator institutions, however, just nine universities awarded any undergraduate certificates, and none awarded as many as UAA. The only institution to come close to UAA's value for undergraduate certificates was Columbus State University, with 77 awarded in 2010.

² The only difference is that in the original report, we used the IPEDS variable, "Percent of total enrollment that are American Indian or Alaska Native," which was shown as whole numbers only. For this report, we calculated the value for that variable by dividing the number of American Indian/Alaska Native students by the total student population to obtain a more precise value.

Additionally, UAA awarded a large number of associate degrees – a total of 702 – in 2010. Eight of the comparator institutions did not confer any associate degrees last year, and all but one institution (Weber State University, at 1,850) awarded far fewer associate degrees than UAA. Conversely, several of the Hanover-identified peer institutions awarded similar amounts of undergraduate certificates and/or associate degrees in 2010, which is to be expected because this was a factor in selecting peer institutions.

We also reviewed the percentage of total degrees awarded that were in the areas of health or science, technology, engineering, and mathematics³ (STEM). To do this, we divided the number of degrees conferred in the areas of health sciences and STEM in 2010 (including all degree and certificate levels shown in the "credentials awarded" figures throughout this report) and divided those values by the total number of degrees conferred in all disciplines. Just two comparator institutions (Indiana University-Northwest and Weber State University) surpassed UAA for the percentage of degree conferrals that were in health sciences; the same was true for the percentage of all degrees that were in STEM disciplines (University of Michigan-Dearborn and University of Alabama in Huntsville). These findings suggest that relative to its comparator peers, UAA awards a large number of degrees in the areas of health sciences and STEM disciplines.

While two of UAA's peer institutions from the Hanover-generated peer list awarded a larger percentage of degrees in STEM disciplines (Purdue University-Calumet Campus and Ferris State University), five of the Hanover-identified peer institutions awarded a larger percentage of degrees and certificates in health sciences (Armstrong Atlantic State University, Indiana University-Northwest, New Mexico Highlands University, Northwestern State University of Louisiana, and Washburn University).

Degree/Certificate-Seeking Status

Another quality that makes UAA unique is that nearly one-quarter of its student population is enrolled with a status of "undergraduate non-degree- or certificate-seeking," as demonstrated in Table 3. In addition, UAA has a very small enrollment of graduate students, at just 6 percent of the total student population. Among the comparator peers, only two other institutions enroll as high a proportion of non-degree- or certificate-seeking students (University of Missouri-St. Louis at 24 percent, and Weber State University at 21 percent). The remaining comparator peers have a non-degree- or certificate-seeking enrollment of 11 percent or less. Similarly, just two comparator peers (Indiana University-Purdue University-Fort Wayne at 6 percent, and Weber State University at 3 percent) enroll as small a proportion of graduate

students; most of the comparator peers have a graduate enrollment of at least 15 percent of the student population.

Because graduate enrollment was factored into the process for selecting peer institutions, many of the Hanover-identified peers have similar proportions of graduate students compared to the total student population. Conversely, the only peer institutions that even approach UAA's concentration of non-degree- and certificate-seeking students are Western New Mexico University (22 percent), the University of Texas at Brownsville (18 percent), Southern Utah University (17 percent) and Indiana University-South Bend (16 percent).

Detailed Enrollment Status

Table 4 shows that UAA is very unique in that it enrolls more part-time students than full-time students, largely due to the sizable population of part-time non-degree- or certificate-seeking students. The only comparator institution with a larger enrollment of part-time students than full time is University of Missouri-St. Louis. However, if we examine only the part-time enrollment of degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduates (44.4 percent for UAA), only three institutions (University of Missouri-St. Louis at 34.9 percent, Weber State University at 39.4 percent and University of Arkansas at Little Rock at 36.6 percent) have similarly high concentrations of part-time undergraduate degree-/certificate-seeking students.

Similarly, most of the Hanover-identified peer institutions enroll more full time students than part-time students overall, although SUNY Empire State College and the University of Texas at Brownsville each have a higher part-time total enrollment. In addition, these two peers also have a higher concentration of part-time degree- or certificate-seeking undergraduate students than UAA, at 59.4 percent and 44.5 percent, respectively.

Student Population Age 25 and Over

Because UAA has a relatively high proportion of older students, we compared the concentration of students age 25 and over across four groups: part-time, full time, graduate and undergraduate populations. In general, UAA's older population figures are comparable to the comparator peer institutions for all categories except undergraduates: with 43.9 percent of undergraduate students age 25 and over, only one comparator peer (University of Arkansas at Little Rock) has a similar enrollment of older students. Similarly, UAA's older enrollment figures appear to be generally comparable to the Hanover-identified peers. Of note, Metropolitan State University and SUNY Empire College stand out as having extremely high concentrations of older students, even among the undergraduate student population.

Student Demographics

Among the comparator peers, UAA has by far the highest concentration of American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) students; all other institutions have less than 2 percent AIAN students. However, UAA appears to be similar to several of its comparator peers in terms of Hispanic or Latino enrollment as well as overall minority enrollment (measured by white enrollment as a percentage of total enrollment).

Although AIAN enrollment was factored into our calculations for identifying peer institutions, just four of the Hanover-identified peer institutions have an AIAN enrollment of over 2 percent: New Mexico Highlands University (6.4 percent), University of Central Oklahoma (4.6 percent), Western New Mexico University, and Northern Michigan University (both 2.9 percent). On average, the Hanover-identified peer institutions are more diverse (measured by white enrollment as a percentage of total enrollment) than the comparator peers: the average percentage of enrolled students that are white among the Hanover-identified peer institutions is 60.4 percent (median of 62.0 percent), compared to an average white enrollment of 69.0 percent (median of 70.1 percent) among the comparator peers.

Graduate Demographics

Table 7 presents the demographic breakdown of 2010 graduates of each comparator peer institution for all degrees and certificates awarded. Once again, UAA has the largest concentration of graduates that are AIAN by a considerable margin, while its concentrations of Hispanic/Latino graduates and total minorities are comparable to the comparator peers. Surprisingly, among the Hanover-identified peers, one institution (New Mexico Highlands University) has a higher concentration of graduates that are AIAN, at 6.5 percent compared to UAA's 5.3 percent.

On average, the Hanover-identified peer institutions have more diverse graduate profiles than the comparator peers. The average concentration of white graduates among Hanover-identified peers is 66.8 percent (median 66.6 percent), while the average concentration of white graduates among the comparator peers is 73.1 percent (median 70.3 percent). Because 71.6 percent of UAA's graduates in 2010 are white, these findings indicate that UAA's graduates are slightly more diverse than many of the comparator peers, but less diverse than many of the Hanover-identified peers.

Comparison of Student and Graduate Demographics




Figure 1: American Indian/Alaska Native Students Enrolled and Graduated

We then compared the demographic breakdowns of enrolled students to 2010 graduates in order to determine if specific race groups are over- or under-represented in graduation figures compared to enrollment figures, starting with AIAN students and graduates. Figure 1 illustrates the findings for the comparator peers: among 11 of

these institutions (including UAA), AIAN Indian students make up a larger proportion of the enrolled population than AIAN graduates compared to the total number of graduates in 2010. Conversely, at ten of the comparator peers, the proportion of enrolled students that are AIAN is smaller than the proportion of graduates that are AIAN, indicating that AIAN students may be more successful at these institutions. Similarly, 13 of the Hanover-identified peer institutions have an AIAN student concentration that is higher than the corresponding AIAN graduate concentration, while just six have a higher concentration of AIAN graduates than enrolled students.




Figure 2: Minority Students Enrolled and Graduated

We compared the same statistics for all other minority groups, which included black or African American, Asian, Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, Hispanic or Latino, two or more races, unknown race, and nonresident alien students and graduates. Figure 2 illustrates these results. Surprisingly, all of the Hanover-identified peer institutions had a higher concentration of these minority groups among students than among 2010 graduates. The same was true among all but two of the comparator peer institutions (University of Missouri-St. Louis and Weber State University).

Retention Rates

Overall, retention rates (the percentage of students from the 2009 cohort that enrolled in fall 2010) were much higher among full time students than part-time students; Table 8 demonstrates these results. Among the comparator peers, the average retention rate for full time students is 69.6 percent, and the median is 70 percent; therefore, UAA's full time retention rate of 71 percent is slightly higher than both the comparator peer group average and median, though by only a small margin. Similarly, UAA's part-time retention rate of 51 percent is higher than both the comparator peer group's average (48.3 percent) and median (48.5 percent). These findings suggest that UAA is performing slightly better than its comparator peers in terms of students who re-enroll after their first year.

Compared to the comparator peers, the Hanover-identified peer institutions have lower average and median retention rates both for full time and part-time students. Full time students at these peer institutions have an average retention rate of 65.8 percent and a median rate of 69.0 percent. Part-time retention rates were even lower, with a group average of 43.2 percent and median of 46.0 percent). Therefore, because previous analyses have indicated that the Hanover-identified peers may be more similar to UAA according to several relevant criteria, it appears that UAA is performing noticeably better than institutions with similar qualities in the areas of full time and part-time student retention.

Graduation Rates

For graduation rates, we provide five sets of statistics available from IPEDS in order to more accurately portray each institution's graduation trends: total cohort, bachelor's degree in four years, bachelor's degree in five years, bachelor's degree in six years, and total for white students.⁴ As shown in Table 8, UAA's graduation rates are noticeably lower than the comparator peer group averages and medians across the board. Interestingly, UAA's total cohort graduation rate (28 percent) is only slightly lower than the group average for the Hanover-identified peer group (30.9 percent), and UAA's graduation rate among white students is actually higher than the group average (33 percent compared to 32.4 percent). Therefore, these findings suggest that while UAA may be underperforming by a considerable margin compared to the comparator peer institutions, UAA is underperforming by a much smaller margin compared to Hanover's set of institutions with more similar qualities.
