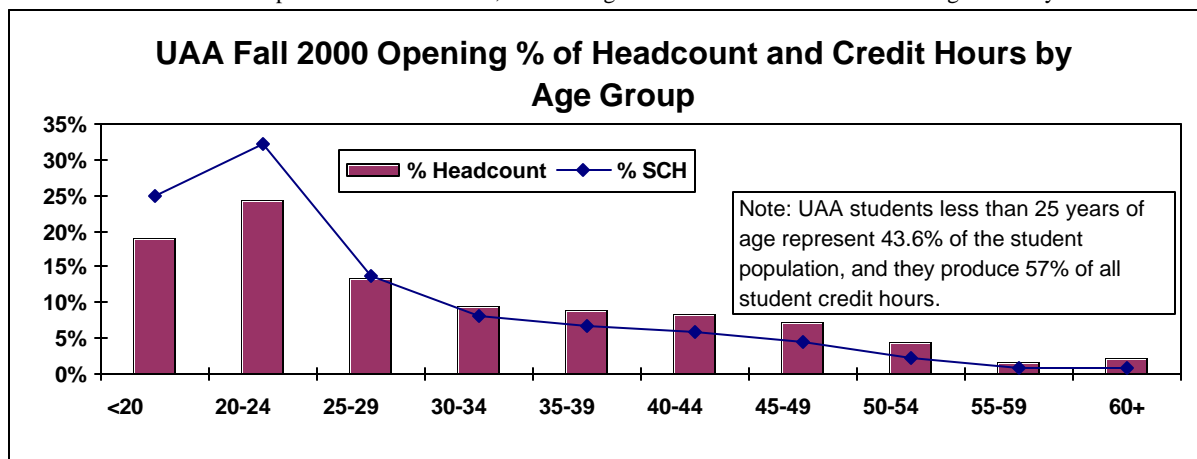

A process for identifying these students has begun and future reports should include this sub-group as well.

by Student Characteristics and Degree Level**

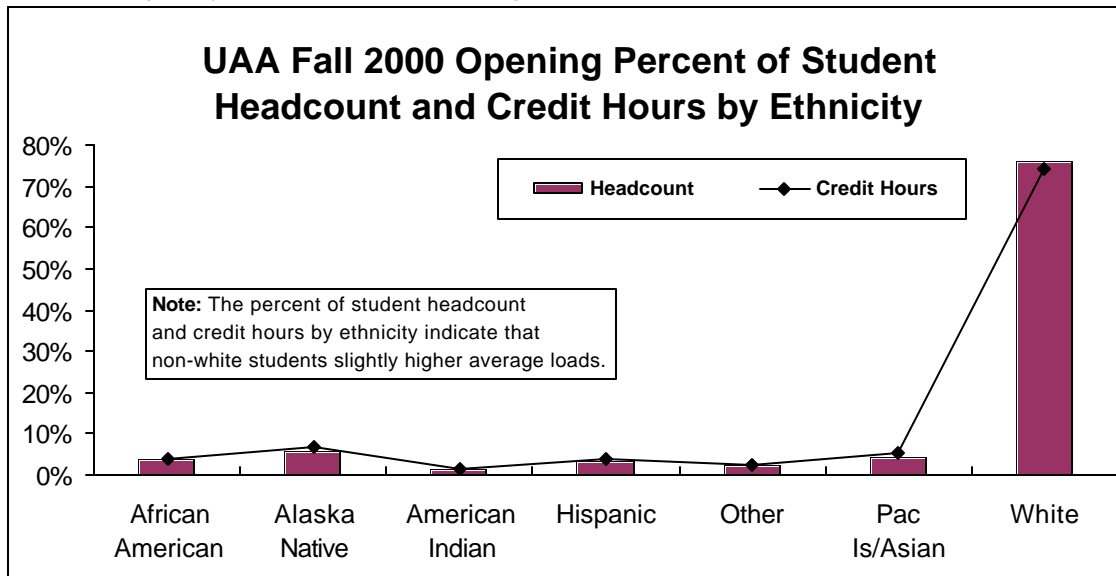

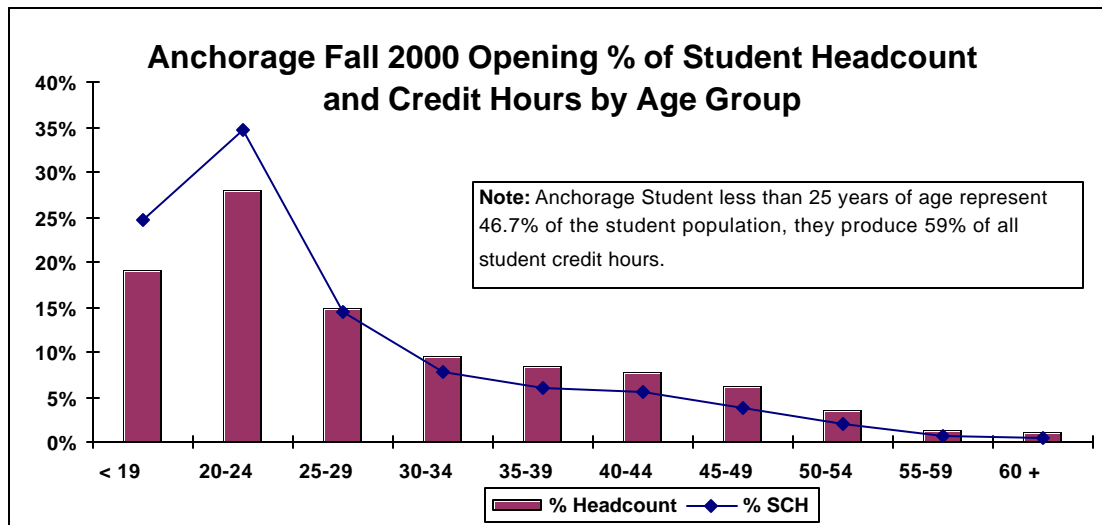

Total UAA Opening Headcount Trend by Student Characteristic

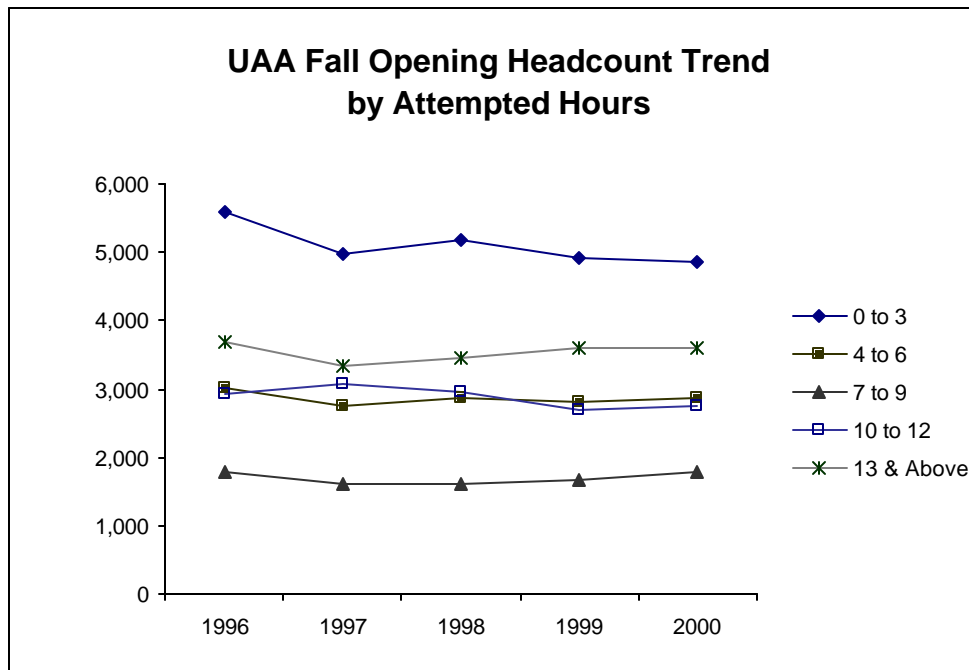

Anchorage Campus Opening Headcount Trend by Student Characteristics

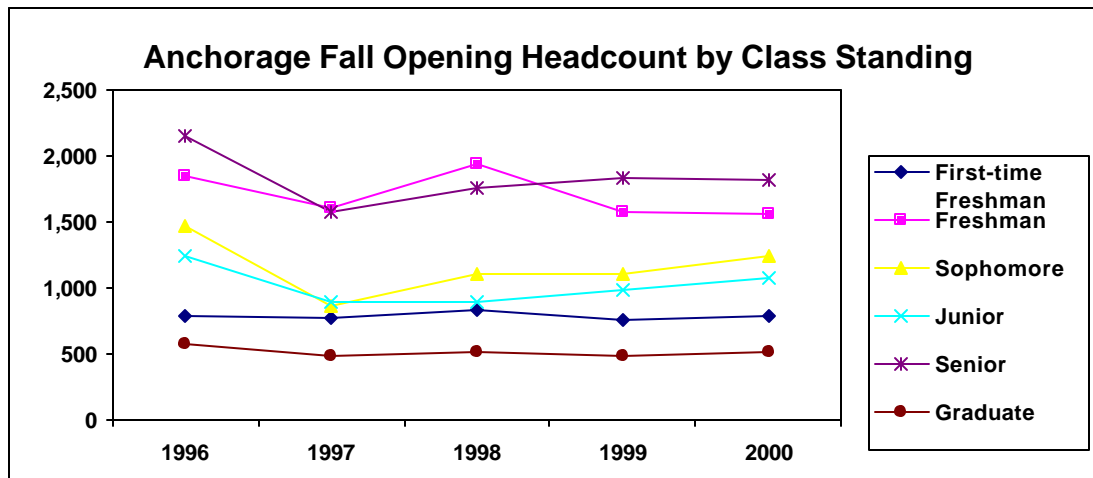
