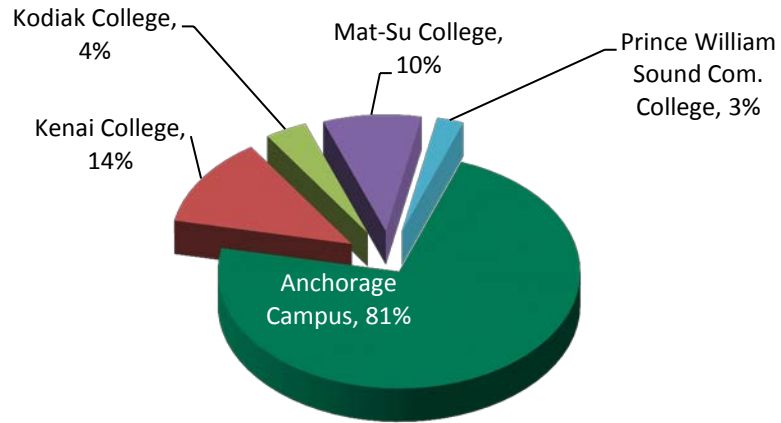

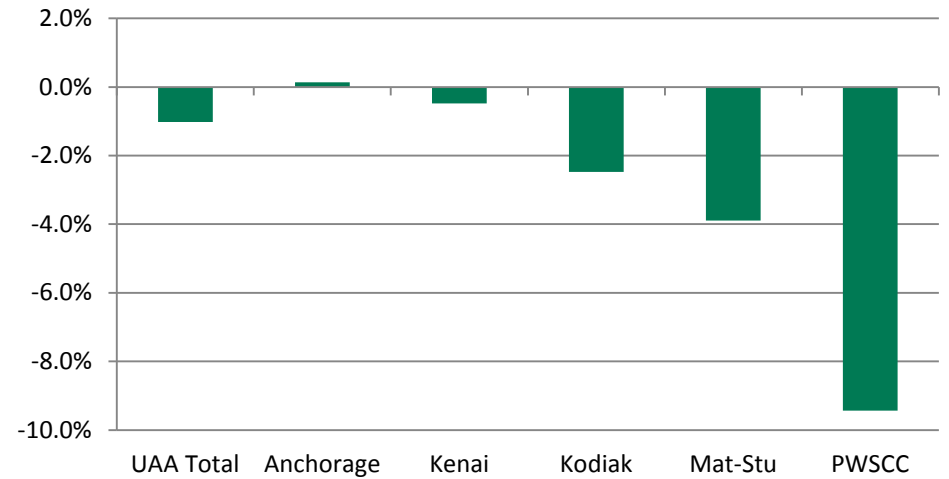

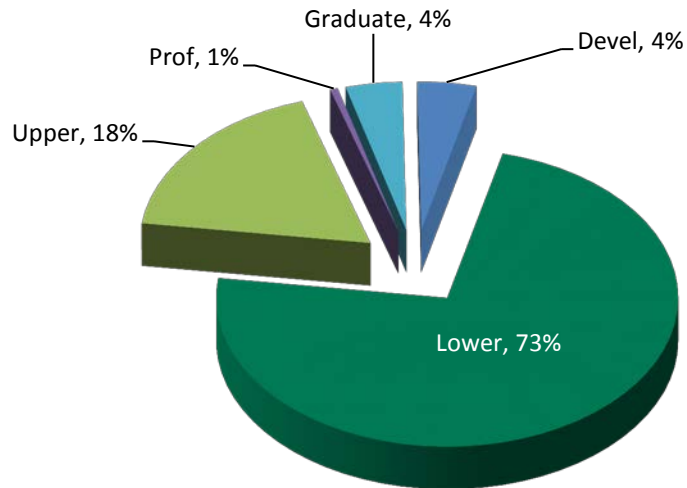
**% of Total Credit Headcount by Campus
Fall 2013 Opening**



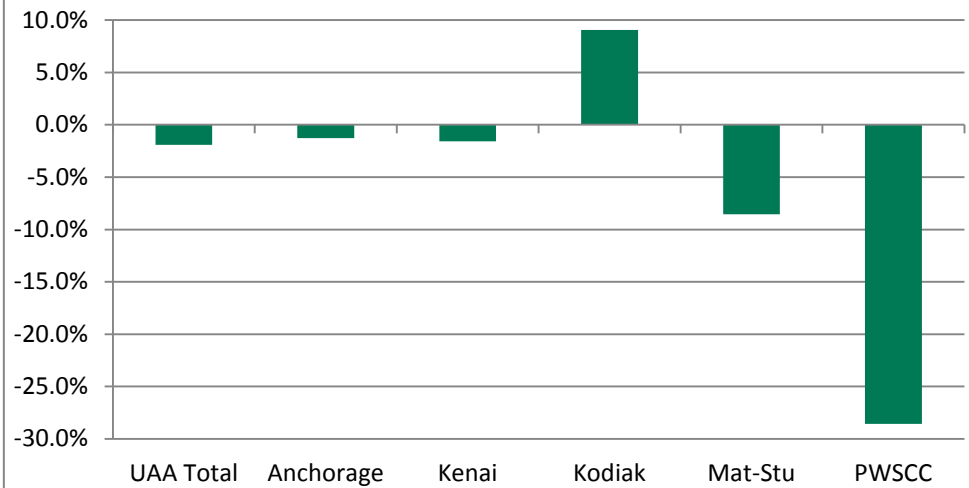
**% Change in Credit Headcount
