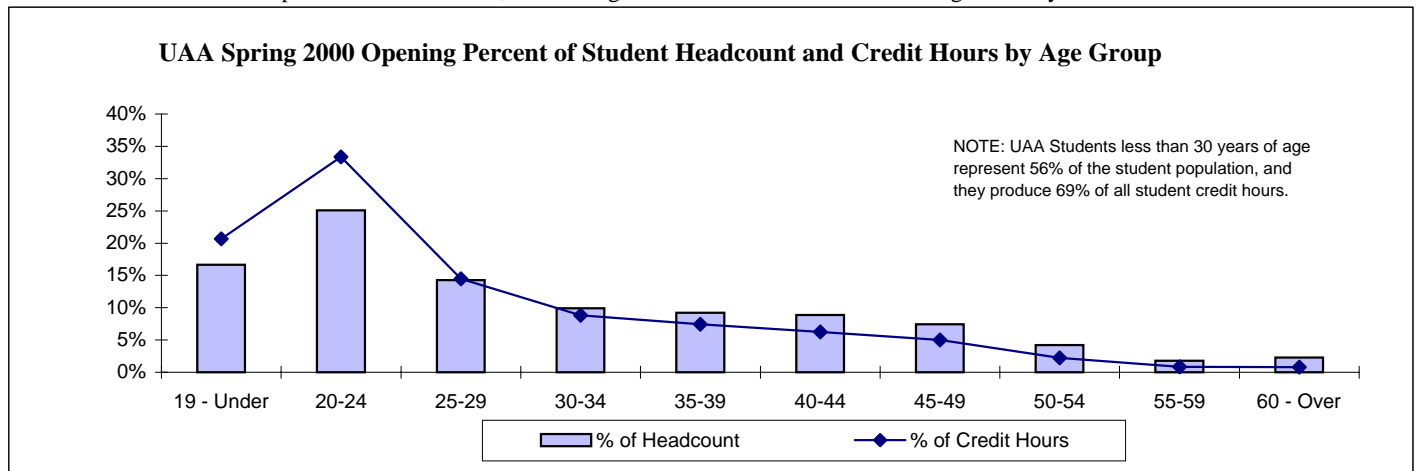

by Student Characteristic and by Degree Level**

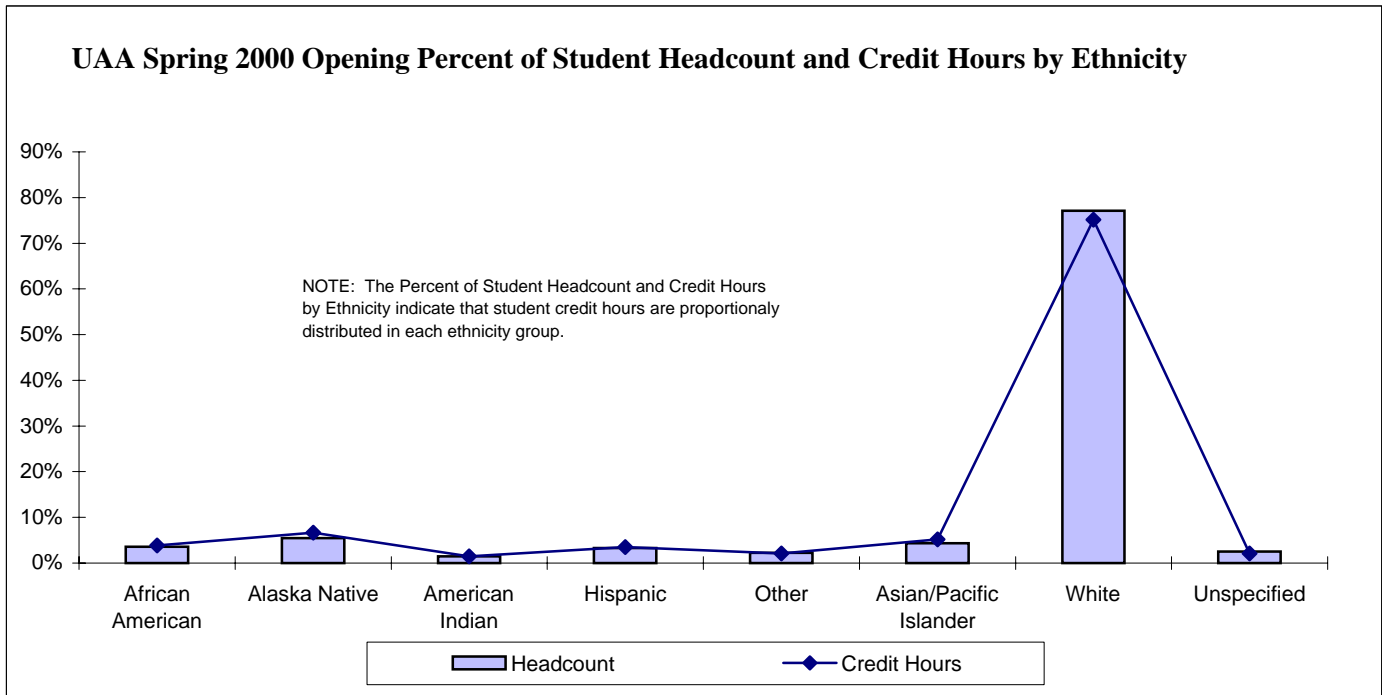

by Student Characteristic and by Degree Level**

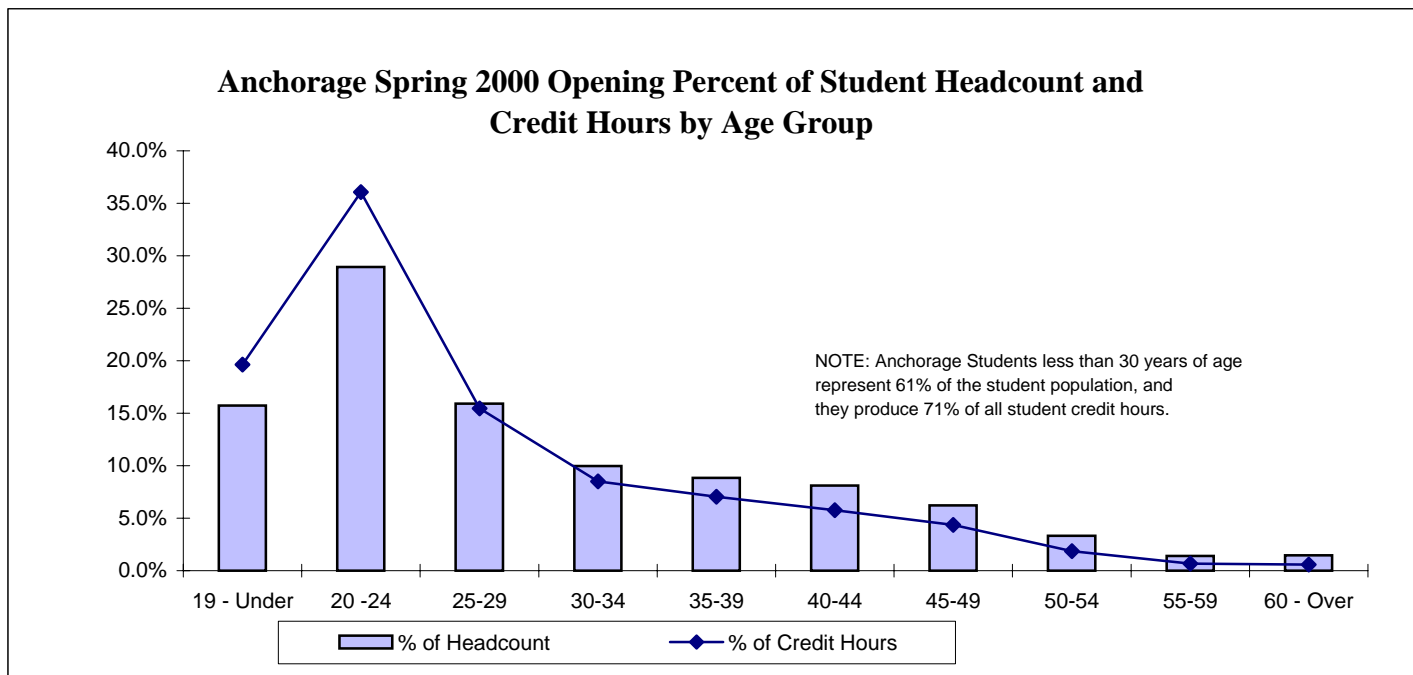

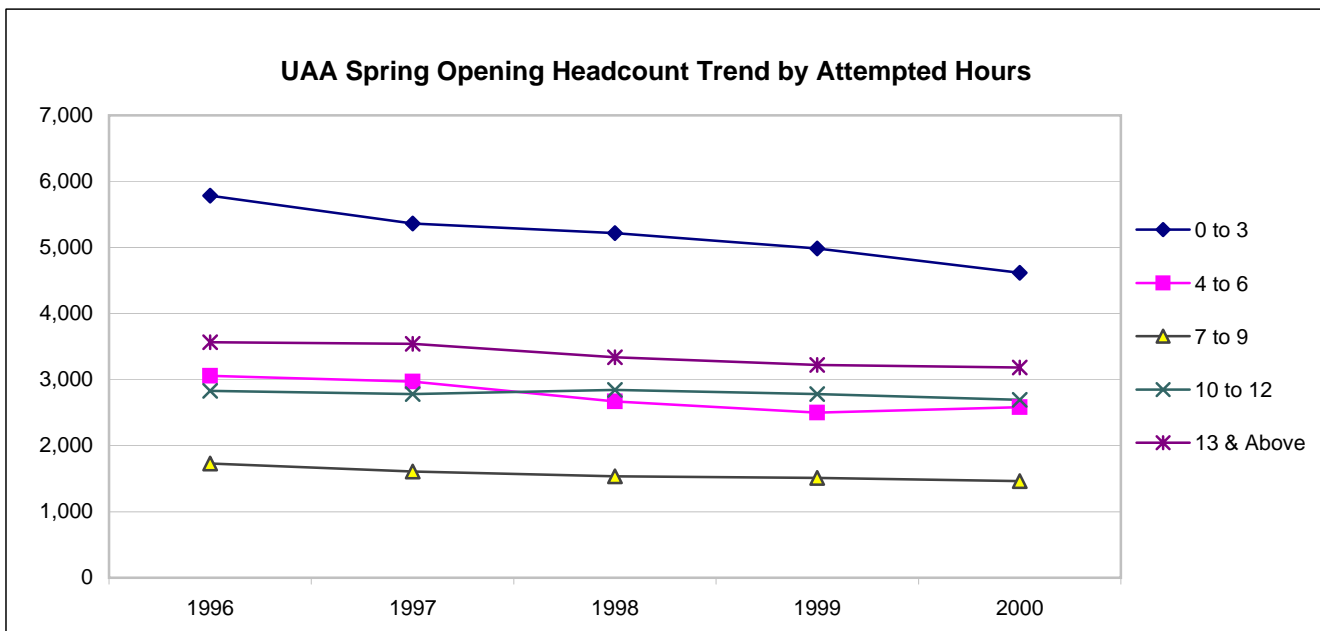

Spring Opening Headcount Trend by Student Characteristic and Campus

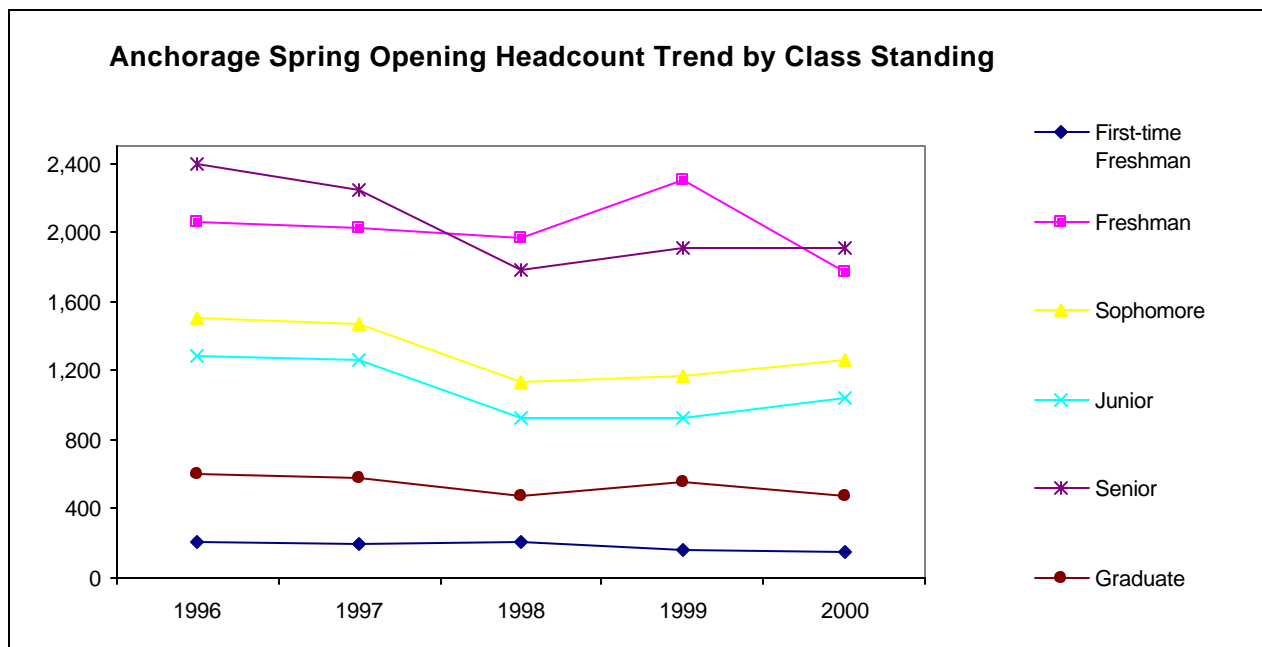

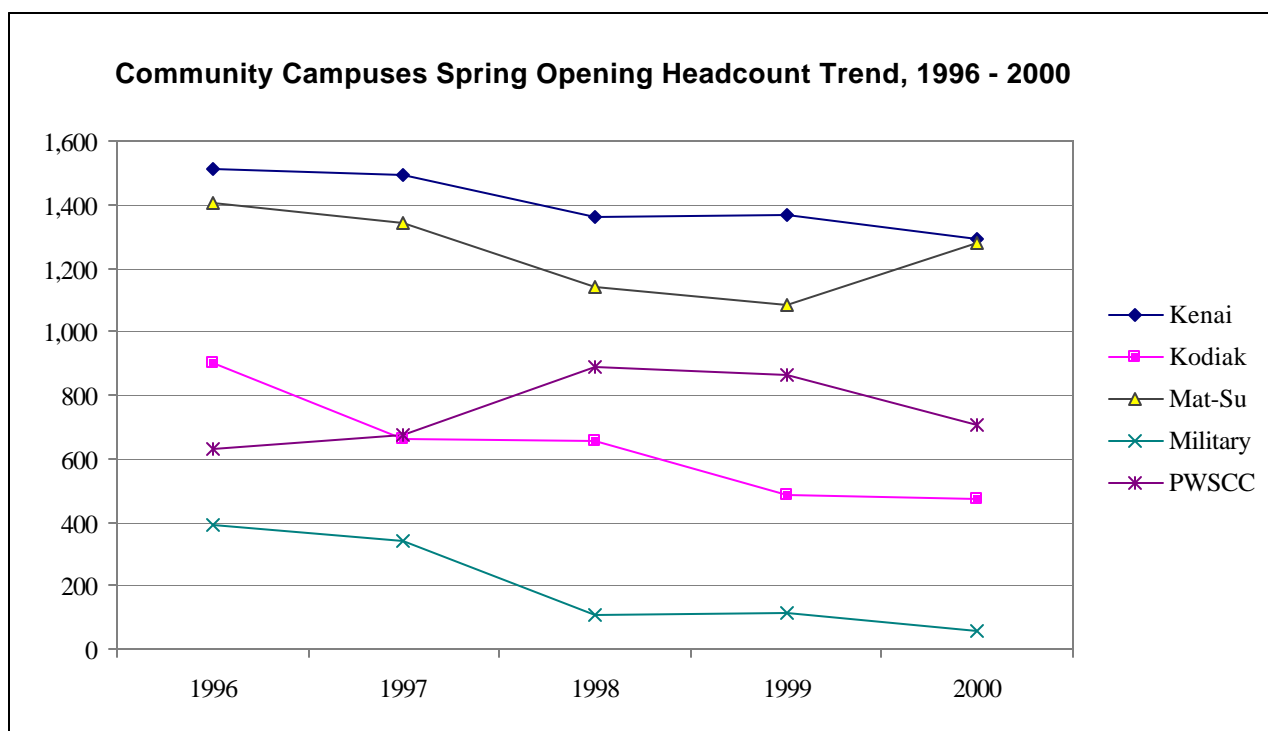

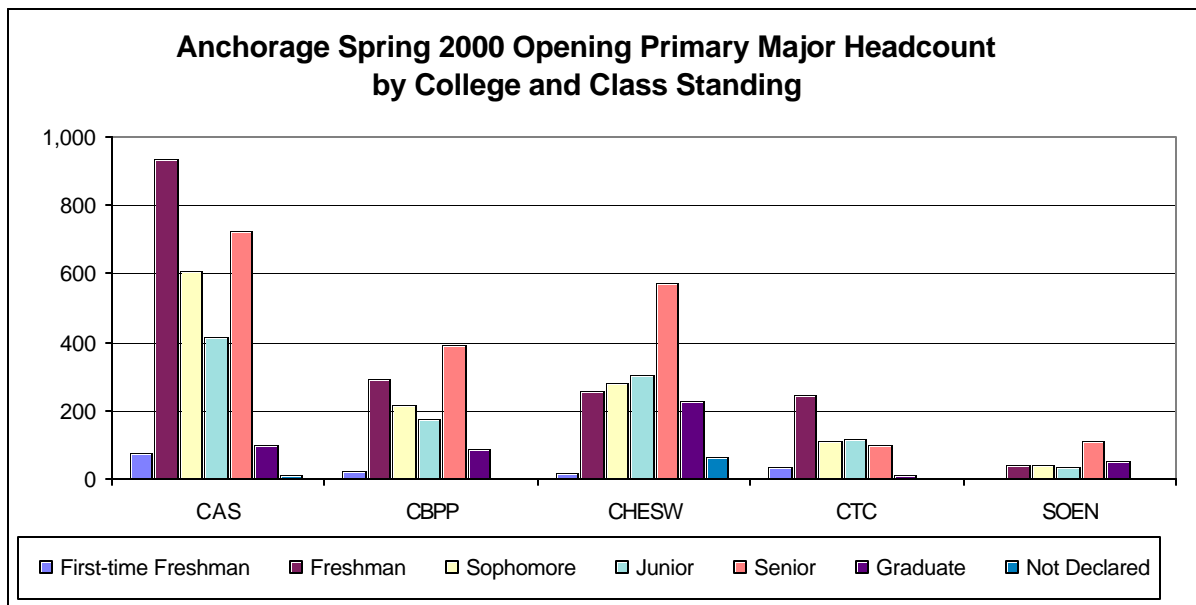

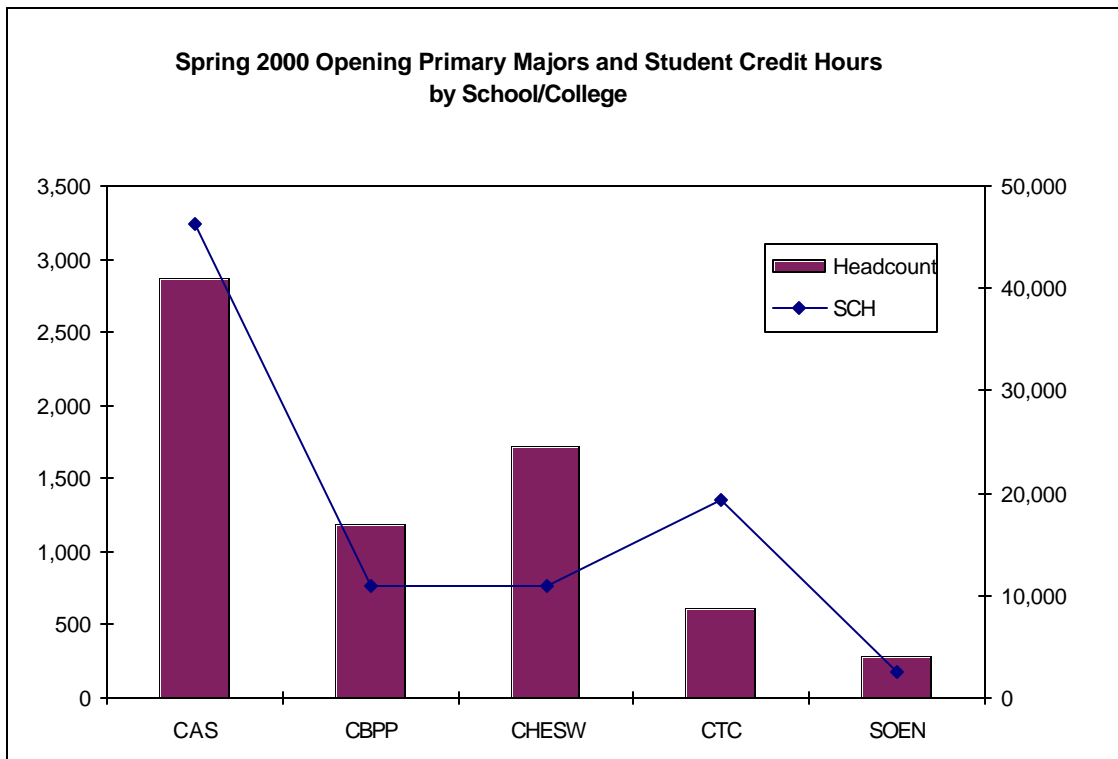

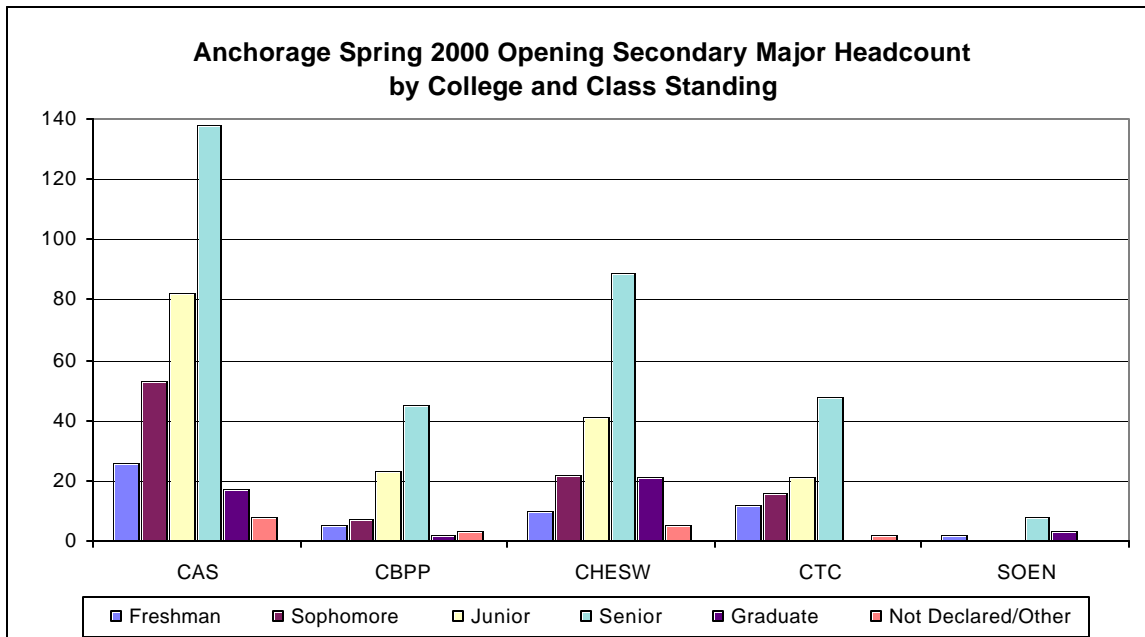

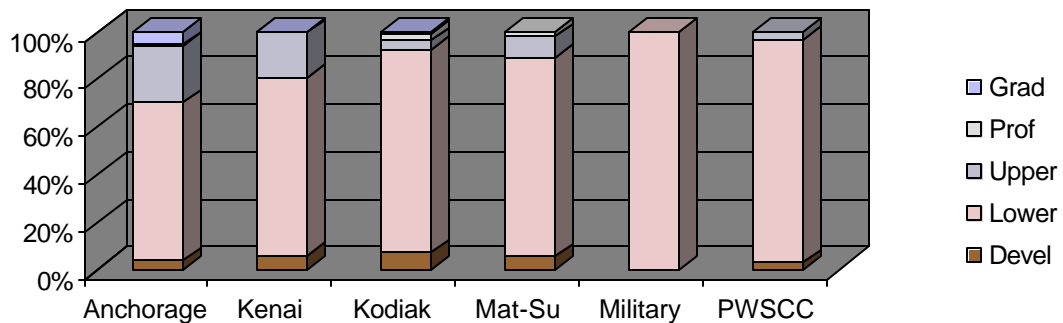
