Accreditation: Staff and faculty are encouraged to attend <u>accreditation events</u>, especially the Staff Forum on October 9 at 10 AM in Library 307.

Parking Updates to Come!: Staff Council representatives have raised concerns regarding the <u>parking fee increases</u> and lack of consultation. We have proposed a tiered parking fee system based on salary, which Vice Chancellor of Administrative Services Ryan Buchholdt expressed openness to. Snow removal contracts and other auxiliary costs are also under review, which could impact future parking fees.

Chancellor Open Forum: Open forums for the <u>Chancellor search</u> are currently underway. Join us for the remaining forums on September 12, 16, & 18 at 9 AM in Library 307 or on Zoom. Feedback forms are provided each, please don't forget to fill them out!

Supervisor trainings: In January 2026, a new supervisor training program will launch. The training will include a foundational 14-hour pathway to be completed over the course of 6 months, plus annual refreshers. A 63-page Supervisor Handbook is in development. There will be optional intermediate and advanced training pathways available.
