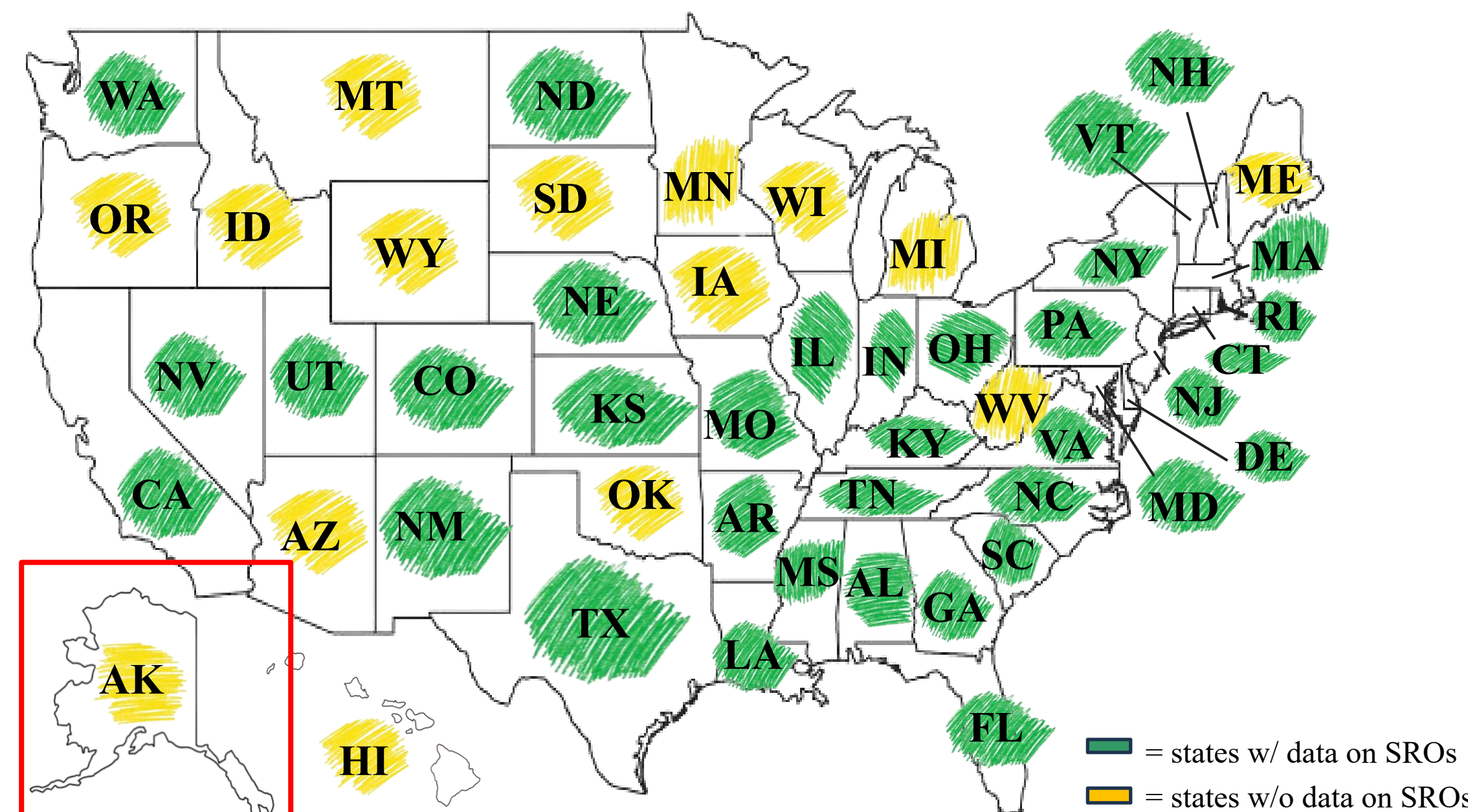

INTRODUCTION

- School Resource Officers (SROs) are a security-related approach that schools have implemented to increase school safety (James & McCallion, 2013)
- SROs are law enforcement officers who receive training through the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) and through the collaborating police department working with the schools (NASRO, 2023)

Purpose

- Study 1 measured Anchorage SROs' location, population served, training, and responsibilities
- This study seeks to:
 - Understand the acceptability, efficacy, and legitimacy of SROs in AK high schools (Fisher & Devlin, 2019)
 - Compare perceptions of SROs gathered from this study to national trends



METHODS

- Recruitment: word-of-mouth, flyers posted on campus, UAA Psychology Research Portal, and UAA Psychology Club Discord and Thread
 - Inclusion criteria: UAA college students 18 years or older who graduated from an AK high school with an active SRO program
 - Target sample size: 100 -150 UAA college students who meet inclusion criteria
- Qualtrics survey
 - 10 to 15 minute online questionnaire
 - Screening questions will be at the beginning of the survey to exclude ineligible participants
 - Survey will assess perceptions of SROs using statements rated on a Likert scale and collect demographic data
- Two surveys will be administered and stored separately
 - Primary survey: Responses about participants' perceptions of SROs
 - Secondary, optional survey: Contact information (names and email addresses) of participants who have completed the primary survey and wish to enter a raffle to win 1 of 10 \$45 gift cards

NEXT STEPS

- Study status: in progress, IRB has approved
 - Survey is live in the UAA Psychology Research Portal
 - Funding for participation incentives has been obtained through CCEL and UAA McNair Scholars Program
- Data collection will last over two months, followed by analysis of trends and differences across groups
 - Perceptions data will be stored and managed by the PI and authorized student researchers
 - Study findings will be disseminated through anonymized, aggregated reports
 - Findings will be published in peer-reviewed academic journals and shared with stakeholders and community organizations
 - Results will provide insight to improve SRO programs
