- To increase school safety, schools adopted School Resource Officers (SROs)
- > SROs are law enforcement officers (James & McCallion, 2013)

<u>Purpose</u>

- 1) Identify where, with whom, and how SROs operate in Alaskan public schools
- 2) Compare the training methods and responsibilities of SROs in Alaskan public schools to current best practice recommendations

➤ Do we measure where SROs are located in ASD?

- We know where and how SROs are in urban areas are assigned to schools
- ➤ Do we measure with whom SROs work in ASD?
 - We know SROs work with students of varying ages, race/ethnicity, economic and disability statuses
- ➤ Do we measure how SROs are trained in ASD?
 - We know training duration and SROs meet most training areas
 - We don't evaluate translation of training into practice
 - We don't know if training occurs in an educational environment
- ➤ Do we measure what SROs do in ASD?
 - We can track the operation of SROs as law enforcers
 - We don't track roles through the same systems
 - We don't know the protocols for responding to calls

DISCUSSION

- ➤ Measuring where and with whom SROs work:
 - Police departments should have a separate page identifying schools where SROs work
- ➤ Measuring how SROs are trained:
 - o Training should occur within school environments
 - Post-training and ongoing assessment to measure the effectiveness of NASRO training
- ➤ Measuring what SROs do:
 - Effectiveness of training is not monitored or measured for fidelity (execution of training)







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
