ALASKA'S FLAG SONG


Eight stars of gold on a field of blue,

The simple flag of a last frontier.



HONORARY DEGREE AWARD

JANIE LEASK Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters

JANIE LEASK has been working to bridge the divide between the two Alaskas—urban and rural—almost since she entered the workforce. Leask is Haida-Tsimshian and Irish-German, was raised in both Metlakatla and Anchorage, and has been formally adopted into the Tsimshian Eagle Clan. As she grew up, she found ways to connect her disparate experiences and learned the fundamentals of effective cross-



cultural communication, something she would carry forward into her work among Alaska's people and industries.

She started her career with Alaska Federation of Natives, matching people with pipeline jobs soon after it began to change the landscape in Alaska. Leask took on new roles and more responsibilities with AFN before being elected president, a position she held from 1982–89. She spent the next 15 years serving first as vice president of community development for National Bank of Alaska, then as manager of community relations for Alyeska Pipeline Service Company. While in these positions, she continued her work in helping further a greater understanding between urban and rural Alaskans. She took over as president and CEO of First Alaskans Institute in 2006, where she served for nearly five years, helping nurture a new generation of Alaska Native leaders.

She has earned numerous awards for her work on behalf of Alaska Natives and rural communities, including a Governor's Award, the Alaska Village Initiative's Chief's Knife Award and CIRI Shareholder of the Year. In 2014, she was inducted into the Alaska Women's Hall of Fame.

Leask and her husband, Don Reed, moved to Homer in 2013, where she became engaged in community activities after retiring from her favorite pastime, women's ice hockey. She is currently a member of the board of directors for Haven House, a local women's shelter, and participates on the State Select Committee on Legislative Ethics.

In recognition of her devotion and commitment in creating honest and respectful connections among diverse communities, the University of Alaska Anchorage proudly confers upon Janie Leask the title of Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters.

MERITORIOUS SERVICE AWARD

JEWEL JONES Meritorious Service Award

JEWEL JONES has built a longstanding career in local government and community nonprofits, dedicating her efforts and the Municipality's attention to underserved populations for the past several decades.

Jewel grew up in Harlem and started her career in Anchorage more than 34 years ago. While holding leadership positions under six mayors, Jewel focused on creating opportunities for minority Alaskans and empowering young people.

While in local government, Jewel held high-level positions in several departments, including the director of Anchorage Social Services Department. Jewel focused on high-need populations, recruiting minority residents into public health careers, establishing the Anchorage Senior Center and advocating for services to low-income families.

After leaving the public sector, Jewel briefly operated her own consulting firm and provided management advice to local businesses. In 2007, she accepted a temporary role as Interim executive director of Anchorage Community Land Trust, a local nonprofit focused on developing and supporting Mountain View—the nation's most diverse census tract. That temporary role lasted seven years and, while serving as director, Jewel helped revitalize the neighborhood by converting an abandoned warehouse into modern office space, creating affordable studio space for area artists and even bringing the first bank in 20 years back to the neighborhood. Earlier this year, the community center at Ridgeline Terrace—a new 70-unit mixed-income housing complex off Mountain View Drive—was named in her honor.

Active in the early years of the Alaska Black Caucus and Alaska Black Leadership Conference, Jewel has previously been recognized for her contributions to Anchorage. In 2001, the Alaska chapter of the National Association of Social Workers named her "Citizen of the Year." She received the Athena Award from the Anchorage Chamber of Commerce in 2003 and the BP/YMCA Women of Achievement award in 2011. In 2013, she was inducted into the Alaska Women's Hall of Fame. She also served eight years as board chair of the Alaska Housing Finance Corp.

In recognition of her support for the diverse populations of Anchorage, the University of Alaska Anchorage proudly awards Jewel Jones the Meritorious Service Award.

JONATHON TAYLOR is a fitting selection for Commencement speaker. After all, he's been speaking on behalf of his 16,000 classmates for the past year as their student body president.



Jonathon took the reins of USUAA—the university's student government organization—in May 2015, a few months after budget concerns began dominating Alaska's headlines, and a few months before University of Alaska named its new president. In times of significant change, Jonathon's role with USUAA often took on the focus of a full-time job, which he balanced with his coursework and his involvement with Seawolf Debate throughout his senior year. Despite the demanding schedule, Jonathon has still excelled academically as an undergraduate while fully dedicating himself to the diverse concerns of the UAA student body.

Today, Jonathon graduates with a bachelor's degree in political science, with minors in communication, economics and journalism. He is a three-time recipient of the UAA Martin Luther King Jr. Leadership Award and has been named to the Chancellor's List each year of his enrollment at UAA. His independent research on media portrayals of the trans community was selected as one of the top papers of the 2015 Student Showcase.

In addition to his work with student government, Jonathon has also made a name for himself on Seawolf Debate. In his first year with the team, his persuasive skills earned him the top novice debater prize at regional tournaments. As a senior, he was ranked 33rd in the world, alongside partner Johanna Richter, after the pair advanced to the elimination rounds of the world tournament in Thessaloniki, Greece this January. Jonathon and Johanna also won the Seattle University Worlds Debate Tournament this December.

Jonathon clearly likes to stay busy, and graduation will provide only a brief rest. Tomorrow, he returns to his job. Yes, in addition to his immense campus involvement, he has also worked full time throughout his senior year.

ACADEMIC TRADITIONS

Robes, Mortarboards, Hoods

An academic legend tells of a wise old Greek who dressed his students in mason's sackcloth robes with mortarboards because, "Their destiny is to build. Some will build cities, some will build lives—perhaps one of them will build an empire; but all will be builders on the solid foundation of knowledge."

Whether or not the ancient Greek dressed his students in sackcloth and mortarboard, the academic robes worn today by graduates and faculty trace their beginnings to the mid-12th century, when small groups studied under the tutelage of a scholar (often a monk or priest). These "students" chose to dress in a robe similar to that of their teacher. Through the centuries, this traditional scholarly dress did not change much. Each individual scholar donned special colors, fur and fabrics, as did his students. In contrast to those Old World customs, today's academic robe has a basic organization that allows you to identify even more about the scholar.

Today's scholars are the university faculty. They wear academic robes with colorful "hoods" reminiscent of the medieval monk's cowl. The size and colors of the hood tell the observer what discipline the scholar pursued and from which college or university he or she graduated.

UAA master's degree graduates will be wearing their hoods today, for they have gone beyond the bachelor's degree to learn more and become scholars. The University of Alaska Anchorage's colors are gold and green, hence these colors on the hood. The velvet trim on the hood signifies the scholar's field. For example, a Master of Education recipient will have his gold and green hood trimmed in light blue; a Master of Science recipient will have his gold and green hood trimmed in golden yellow.

Some colleges and universities use the soft beret, but the prevailing style of cap is the traditional square mortarboard, decorated with a long tassel. You may notice some faculty wearing a soft beret-style cap.

It does not matter whether the tassel is worn on the left or right of the mortarboard, but it is often customary to change the tassel to the other side after receiving the diploma.

While you may not be able to identify the origins of each specific academic robe and hood appearing in today's commencement ceremony, you can reflect that from the certificate graduate in his black gown to the Doctor of Philosophy, student and professors alike are paying homage to more than 800 years of academic tradition.

University Mace

The grand marshal carries the University of Alaska Anchorage mace in the commencement procession and places it in a stand on the stage during commencement ceremonies to signify the importance of the occasion. The UAA Alumni Association commissioned the mace in 1990 and two talented UAA employees created it. Dr. Vern Oremus, former dean of UAA's previous College of Career and Vocational Education, used a lathe to create the wooden staff and head. Associate Professor of Art Mariano Gonzales designed and produced the sterling silver torch at the top of the mace. The mace symbolizes UAA as a university of distinction and is traditionally entrusted to the faculty in recognition of their critical role in the education of our students.

GRADUATING WITH HONORS

UNIVERSITY HONORS

Associate and baccalaureate degree students graduating with honors in May 2016 are wearing a gold honor cord. Throughout the program, they are recognized by the stars next to their names. Honors are indicated as follows:

To be eligible to graduate with honors, associate and baccalaureate degree-seeking students must first earn a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or above in all college work attempted at UAA. A transfer student who is earning an associate degree must complete a minimum of 15 resident credits with academic letter grades to be eligible to graduate with honors. A transfer student who is earning a baccalaureate degree must complete a minimum of 30 resident credits with academic letter grades to be eligible to graduate with honors. All transfer students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or above in all college work attempted both at UAA and at all other accredited institutions attended and for all courses used to fulfill the degree program in order to graduate with honors. At UAA, graduation with honors represents a student's entire academic history. All grades and credits earned will be included in determining eligibility to graduate with honors (Ds, Fs, retaken courses, courses lost in academic bankruptcy, etc.). In addition, a student transferring coursework and grades must have a minimum of 70 percent of their credits submitted with letter grades to be eligible to graduate with honors. Honors are awarded to associate and baccalaureate degree students with cumulative GPAs as follows:
