*Note: For classes with irregular start or end dates, the drop with 100 percent refund period ends at 5 p.m. five business days after the published class start day. Students wishing to change from credit-to-audit must do so by the end of the drop period.*

# TUITION

Tuition is determined by:

- the number of course credits
- the level (e.g., 100-level, 200-level) of the course
- the student's residency status

Students taking 4 or fewer credits are charged at the resident rate. There are many ways to get [reduced or resident tuition](#). Students from certain western-region states may also be [eligible for reduced tuition \(WUE/WRGP\)](#).

For professional development course numbers, 500-599, tuition costs vary. Contact the academic department or refer to specific course listing on UAOnline.

## TUITION SURCHARGE

Certain colleges assess a tuition surcharge for certain courses.

- The College of Engineering (COEng) has a tuition surcharge of \$49 per credit hour for upper division courses, and \$93 per credit hour for graduate courses.
- The College of Business and Public Policy (CBPP) has a tuition surcharge of \$49 per credit hour for upper division courses, and \$93 per credit hour for graduate courses.

# FEES

There are two types of enrollment based fees.

- Mandatory student fees are charged to students based on credit load (how many credits they are taking).
- Course fees are charged based on particular class types. For example, online courses have particular fees or lab classes may have individual lab fees to cover materials.

## MANDATORY STUDENT FEES

Mandatory student fees are charged to all students (including secondary school students) registered for credit in at least 1 credit. The Aviation Complex, King Career Center and University Center are considered on-campus facilities for purposes of fee assessment. Student fees are not refundable unless the student totally withdraws during the 100 percent refund period. The following tables detail fee charging structures for fall and spring and for summer terms.

# Fall and Spring Mandatory Fees

For fall and spring semesters, students may elect to pay certain student fees if they are registered in 1 to 5 credits in one semester. Student Life Fees (Student Activities and Athletic/Rec fees) for students registered in fewer than 6 credits are set as a fixed rate.

Student Health and Counseling Center services are not available to students registered in fewer than 6 academic credits.

Laboratory and pharmacy services available at greatly reduced costs. ## COURSE FEES

Course fees vary by course and are shown on the UAOnline detailed class information pages. To view fees for a specific class, go to the [UAOnline Class Schedule Search](#) and click on the class CRN.

- **Administrative Fee:** An administrative fee may be charged instead of tuition.
- **eLearning Fee:** \$25 per credit is charged for each Anchorage campus distance course (section numbers starting with 2, 5 or 8 depending on the term).
- **Lab and Materials Fees:** These additional charges cover the costs of lab supplies. Refer to the specific class listing on [UAOnline](#) for more information on lab and material fees. These fees are not refundable unless the class is dropped during the 100 percent refund period.
- **Network Charge:** Four percent of tuition for academic year 2017-18. Covers rapidly rising costs, especially in the maintenance and enhancement of university-wide technology infrastructure. This fee will be applied on a course-by-course basis to tuition, nonresident surcharges if applicable, and fees in lieu of tuition, for credit and noncredit courses. Courses with applicable fees charged in lieu of tuition less than the lower division credit hour tuition rate (\$183 for 2015-16) will be exempt from the charge. All calculated fees will be rounded to the nearest dollar.
- **Special Fees:** Special fees are assessed to pay for travel, equipment or facilities out of the ordinary.

## OTHER FEES

The following fees are applicable in specific circumstances and do not apply to everyone.

- **Continuous Registration Fee (graduate students):** The continuous registration fee is \$466 for 2017-18.
- **Late Payment Fees:** A \$125 fee will be assessed on all accounts which are not paid by the payment deadline. An additional \$175 fee will be assessed later in the semester on all accounts still outstanding. Students who pay for or drop their courses prior to the published payment deadline will not be assessed the fee. Find payment deadlines on the [Registration Dates and Deadlines calendar](#).
